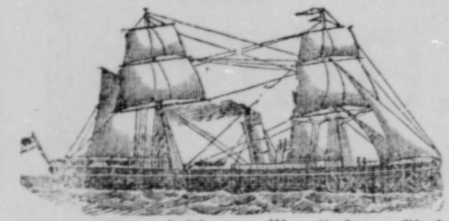

### Of Special Interest to our Farmers

Give the Boy a Chance.

The farmer should certainly have better judgment than the inexperienced boy of the budding mustach. Which should then order affairs on the farm? This is not so easily answered as might appear on the surface. Considered simply as a money making enterprise, an experienced brain at the helm is certainly a proper thing. What should we think of the pilot who turns over the helm to an inexperienced boy? Or of a lawyer who gives our case no personal attention and lets his inexperienced boy plan for our defence? We hire an expert to fix up our machinery, and he sends some one who is not posted in the matter. We kick. So when there is a difference of opinion between the farmer and his boy, the farmer naturally insists upon his own plans, for he has tested them, has longer experience and must suffer if things turn wrong, for there are bills to be met and taking ill-advised risks is wrong and adopting plans which his judgment disapproves looks foolish to him.

For all that we hold that the boy should have his own way part of the time. Raising boys is one part of it. Producing beef and bread and butter is farm work, but the reason of producing beef and bread and butter is to produce brain and brawn from it. The boy is of more consequence than all the other stock. As a colt needs training, so does the boy. Trying the colt behind a wagon is a poor way to train him. Trying the boy behind the wheels in his father's head is a poor way to train the boy. Both boy and colt need to understand that there are proper things to observe and and improper things to get clear of, but neither can be educated without giving him the use of his own head. The boy's judgment needs exercising in order to develop it. Let him do some things as he thinks best, even if you feel positive you know a better way. The boy will learn in this way, and better than you can teach him by holding him in your well-worn rut. And then again the boy may beat you and improve upon your own methods. Such things are no infrequent. Divide responsibility and honors with the boy. That is fair and it is the part of wisdom.—E. C. Bennett in Hoard's Dairyman.

### Three Essentials in Dairying.

We are frequently asked, what are the more important points in dairying. While there are too many to be enumerated here, there are three things of which I want to speak briefly which are to me of great importance and on which our success as dairymen largely depend. These are breeding, feeding and care of the dairy stock.

Upon breeding depends altogether the quality of milk a cow will give, for be it remembered a cow has it born in her the power to give rich or poor milk and if poor, nothing that man can do will improve her in that line. But the quantity of milk a cow will give is determined by the one who has the care of her from the time she is born until she comes into dairy work, and depends almost exclusively on the feed and care given her. The word "care" means a great deal in the education of a dairy cow; it does not mean food and shelter alone; it means education, that we develop in a cow a love for us, or as it is usually expressed, affection. The more affectionate the cow the more valuable she is in the dairy. In our work we must remember that we have to do with the great law of maternity which induces a cow to give milk for her offspring.

She gives it in part because of the affection she as a mother has for her

young. The more of this mother love we have in the cow the better, but to develop and draw out this love, she must have kind treatment from her owner, from the time she is born until she goes out of the dairy. She must have a mother's treatment and a mother's care—M. E. King, in Coleman's Rural World.

### How to Kill out Sorrel

At this time of year many pastures and newly seeded meadows are red with sorrel sending up its seed stalk. Where this weed abounds, especially if the field has been liberally seeded with clover, it means that the soil is deficient in either potash or lime, which clover must have and which sorrel can do well enough without. Because sorrel itself is sour, farmers often say the land it grows on is "sour" also. But sorrel is almost always abundant on sandy land where there is no surplus of water to make it sour, but which is always deficient in lime or potash or both. The best way to keep out sorrell is to give the land a dressing of potash in available form, and then sow ten quarts of clover seed per acre with the grain crop which has had 200 pounds of superphosphate drilled in with the seed. The clover if evenly sown will entirely smother the sorrel and kill it, though if there are any missed places these will be red with sorrel, showing that the weed tried to grow but was smothered out.—Exchange.

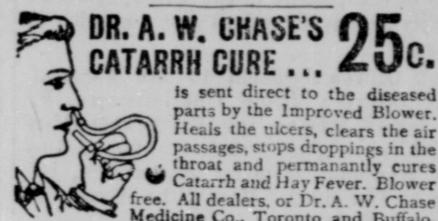
