Radar Speed Detection Unit Demonstrated To Police

Yesterday morning a number of police officers and other interested citizens had the opportunity of seeing first hand the operation of a radar speed meter which is being shown on the Island through the co-operation of the centre for safety education, New York University.

Mr. William Toth who is in charge of the equipment explained briefly the operation of the equipment which is in actuality a small sending and receiving station. The machine which can be mounted either in a car or on the side of the road sends out a radio beam which is in turn reflected back by the on coming vehicle.
