After the ceremony, Lt. Gen. Walton H. Walker, U.S. Eighth Army commander, told correspondents that the Red army is smashed and "the war is over."

An American communiqué early Saturday said Red activity in the Seoul area was "confined to four small counter-attacks," all repulsed.

The North Korean Communist radio at Pyongyang kept up its running theme, however, that Red troops are "repulsing overwhelming superior enemy forces in bitter inch-by-inch fighting" in Seoul.

Directors appointed for 1950-51 include Miss Mary MacLennan Charlottetown; Messrs. Malcolm Reeves; Austin Kennedy, Gay Judson, Alexandra; Lloyd Balderston, Cross Road; Edward MacPhail, Southport; and W. B. Creed, Highfield.

60,191 boxes of strawberries were sold by the association during the 1950 strawberry season, it was announced by the manager, Mr. E. D. Reid. The total money returns were \$11,361.43 for an average price per box of 18.8 cents.

The financial statement showed that the total net receipts amounted to \$11,115.13, with the expenditures amounting to \$11,106.42 leaving a balance of \$8.71 for the 1950 season.

U. S. Casualties In Korean War WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The announced total of U. S. casualties in the Korean war rose to 17,220 today.

The Defense Department reported the figure as the total of casualties whose families had been notified through Sept. 22. It is 3,309 higher than the cumulative total announced through Sept. 15.

It includes 2,441 dead, 11,060 wounded and 3,999 missing in action.

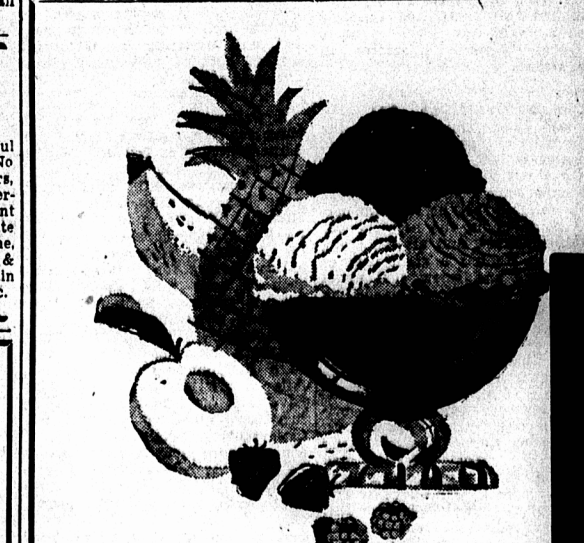
