Pleased With New Appointment At Summerside

Great pleasure at being posted to command R. C. A. F. Station, Summerside, was expressed at a press conference yesterday by Group Captain H. C. Richards, O. B. E., who will formally take over command from Wing Commander R. F. Gross on Monday.

G/C Richards has never been on the island before but he said that he recently had the pleasure of making the acquaintance of the P. E. I. Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Walter Shaw, who was visiting in Stockholm, Sweden and he took advantage of the opportunity to ask him a great many questions about the place that is to be his home for the next year or two.

Since arriving here he has driven about the Province a great deal and admired the beauty of the countryside. At present with Mrs. Richards and their two children he is living at the Charlottetown Hotel. Mrs. Richards is a native of Kentucky.

The new commanding officer said before coming here he had heard many good things about Summerside which he feels sure are due to the stewardship of W/C Gross who is now relinquishing command.

G/C Richards has recently been air attaché in Sweden and Finland and he described the people of those countries as "charming and hospitable". Sweden, he said, is a very modern country and has fairly large defence forces. His air force career commenced in 1927 when he joined the Royal Air Force.

After getting his wings he served five years in India. On his return to England he took a course in navigation and for a time was an instructor in Belfast, Ireland. G/C Richards left the R. A. F. in 1938 and came to Canada, where he joined the R.C.A.F. at the outbreak of World War Two.

For a while he served with the Directorate of Air Force Manning and later was personal assistant to Air Chief Marshal Broadhead, then chief of the Air Staff. He later commanded the Service Flying School at Brantford and from this command was posted overseas. After the war he took a staff college course and was then sent to Sweden.

The ceremonial parade in connection with the "handing over" ceremony will be at one o'clock standard time on Monday and the public are welcome to attend. S

ROY KENNEDY

On Friday evening, July 14th, the residents of Centre Line Road and vicinity learned with deep regret of the death, at the Western Hospital, Alberton, of Roy Kennedy deceased had been seriously ill for a number of days before his death, his end came unexpectedly to many.

He was born at Waterford on December 8th, 1919, and was a son of Albert and the late Mrs. Kennedy of that place.

Shortly after World War II broke out he answered the call of his country and joined the Armed Services. He served with the Royal Canadian Ordnance Corps for almost six years. After he received his honorable discharge from the army, he settled in Centre Line Road where he operated a Sawing Mill until a few weeks previous to his death.

His quiet and courteous disposition won for him a host of friends. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him especially by his wife and little children who will always remember him as a faithful husband and devoted father.

During his illness he was frequently visited by his good Pastor, Reverend Patrick Walsh, Palmer Road and it was he who administered to him the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church. There are left to mourn his passing his sorrowing widow, the former Rosella O'Brien and two children namely: Helen, 4 years and Robert, 2 1/2 years. He is survived also by his father, Albert and his step-mother, Mrs. Kennedy of Waterford; Pat of Halifax, N. S.; Russell of Montreal, P. Q.; Leo of Ottawa, Ont.; and George of Lennox Island.

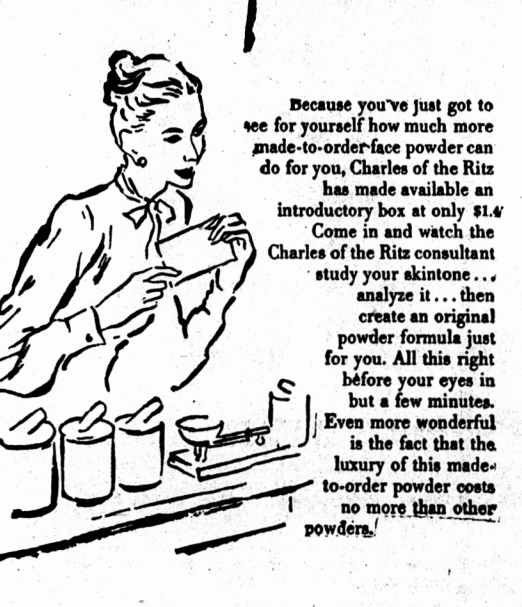
