**CONTRACT BRIDGE**

At most tables the bidding proceeded as shown. A good case can be made for North to pass the one heart bid, and it would find support in this corner, but the majority view was to respond one notrump. Several Norths, just to be different, responded one spade.  
The queen of diamonds was generally opened and usually declared ducked it, hoping for a diamond continuation or a spade switch. The eight of clubs was in dummy for the first and last time.  
The nine of hearts was led and when East played low it was allowed to run to West's king. In all these cases declarer made three hearts, losing two spades, a heart and a diamond.  
At most tables, though, the contract was defeated when East covered dummy's nine of hearts with the jack. This play promoted West's eight of hearts and gave him a second trump trick to beat the hand.  
East's cover of the nine of hearts is an extension of the principle of covering an honor with an honor. No harm can come from playing the jack, but a trick is likely to be gained in every case where West has four hearts which include the eight and any high honor.

**Sinai Desert Is Preferred To Comfortable Canadian Base**

NAPLES, Italy (CP)—The love of risk and adventure is still dominant in the hearts of Canadian airmen and the man with the operational patches is the envy of his mates.  
This is the opinion of Group Capt. W. P. Pleasance of Calgary, chief of Canada's air component in the United Nations Emergency Force. He bases his opinion on the fact his men have a high preference for the isolated life of the Egyptian Sinai compared to the relatively easy living of this distracting old Italian city.  
The air component has two distinct jobs and co-operates in third. In four big boxcar packets, it flies a relay of UNEF men, mail and material between here and Abu Suweir or El 'Arish in Egypt. It carries the cargo to the desert outpost and the pilots make reconnaissance. It services the big four-engined North Stars—purely a Canadian venture—that fly the supply route from Canada.
