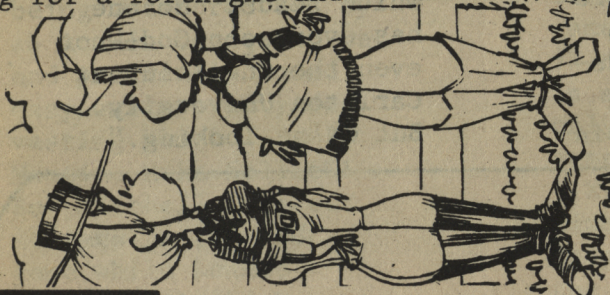
I know that they are a very delicate colour but the girl in the shop showed me hers that she had been wearing for a fortnight and

they were hardly soiled.

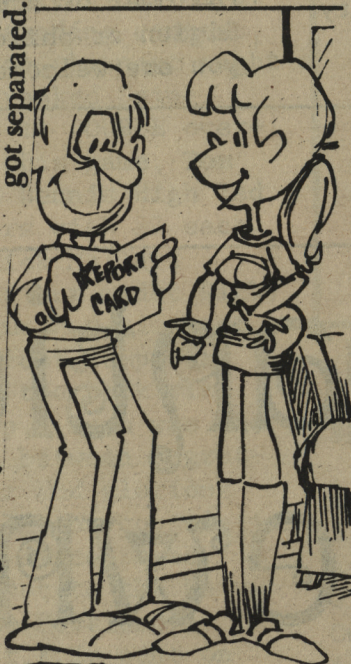

Scholarships Bursaries

SECOND-LANGUAGE STUDY FELLOWSHIPS

Each year, the Federal Government offers approximately 630 fellowships of up to \$2,000 each to post-secondary students who wish to pursue their studies in their second official language in Canada for a period of one year. No allowance is made for travel expenses under this programme. In certain cases, and at the discretion of the provincial or territorial authorities, a student belonging to the minority official language group may be awarded a fellowship for a year of study in his first official language.

ACADEMIC YEAR ABROAD INC.

The university-level program is open to qualified college sophomores, juniors, seniors, and graduates who are competent to follow university courses in French and is designed to earn a credit recommendation of

16 semester-hours each term. Students with less competence in French will be considered for the program, provided that they and their advisors recognize that a beginner or a near-beginner in French must concentrate almost entirely on language studies, at least for the first semester abroad. ATTENTION GRADUATE STUDENTS CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY Valued at \$11,500 per annum, including living allowance, provision for books, tuition, travel and research costs related to the project. Awards are available to Canadian citizens who indicate their intention or pursue an active career in international development work.

AWARDS FOR RESEARCH AND STUDY IN MENTAL RETARDATION

The National Institute on Mental Retardation is offering awards to students registered in graduate studies at a Canadian University, and planning a career either directly in mental retardation, or an associated professional field. This award offers one year of financial support, ranging up to \$6,000, plus a one week period of orientation training at the National Institute on Mental Retardation. Awards are not renewable but candidates may apply for a second year of support.
