BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows:—

1st. The rate of Assessment on Real Estate for general Civic purposes, under said Statute, for the year commencing the First day of January, A. D. 1890, and ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1890, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of seven-eighths of one per cent. on every dollar of the value of Real Estate, as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City, and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein, made and returned by them on the Fifth day of April, 1889, and as such General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll is added to, revised and corrected by their subsequent similar returns made by them on the 21st day of March, A. D. 1890, and duly returned by them on the 25th day of March, A. D. 1890.

2nd. The rate of Assessment on Personal Property for such general Civic purposes, for the year commencing the First day of January, A. D. 1890, and ending the 31st day of December, A.
