the 28th day of January, A. D. 1891, at the several places, that is to say: In Ward No. 1, at or near Fire Engine House on King Street, between Great George and Prince Streets. In Ward No. 2, at or near the house of Thomas Connolly, opposite Mr. E. Hearty's Warehouse, Sidney Street, between Great George and Prince Streets. In Ward No. 3, at or near the Market House, corner of Kent and Queen Streets. In Ward No. 4, at or near the carriage shop of Carroll & McAleer, corner of Euston and Great George Streets.
