## Kensington's Tax Rate Is Unchanged For 1959

**KENSINGTON** — Mayor Everett Champion presided at the Kensington Town Council meeting last night when five of six councillors were present. Problems relating to the recently installed sewerage system, tax assessment and other subjects were discussed. The rate of assessment of real and personal property, poll tax and license rates for 1959 will remain the same as in 1958. The sewerage disposal charge was set at \$12 a year. Police Officer Reeves reported total fines for the month of June amounted to \$164.75. After some discussion it was decided to have shales trucked and levelled on the streets that are to be prepared for paving.

## Summerfield W.M.S. Mark Their 50th Anniversary

An inspiring and significant meeting was held at the home of Mrs. J. A. and Mrs. Clark Harding, Monday afternoon, July 6, when three charter members, Mrs. (Rev.) Alexander MacKay, Mrs. J. A. Harding and Mrs. Hugh F. MacKay and other guests met with the members of the Summerfield Auxiliary of the W. M. S. to participate in a service commemorating the 50th anniversary of their organization. The president, Mrs. Leeland Mayne, presided and opened the meeting with the Call to Worship followed by the hymn, "Oh Zion haste, Thy Mission High fulfilling," said the "Aim and Object in union." Comment was read by the president.

Rev. L.M. Murray conducted a thought-provoking discussion on the scripture readings which were read by Mrs. Elmer Stewart, Mrs. Herman and Mrs. Keith Mayne, the theme being "Discovering Neighborhood." It was decided that it is possible to have a loyalty to the ideal of world community compatible with love of one's own country. It was thought that our mistrust of people of other races stemmed from misunderstanding and lack of knowledge of their cultural background, language, etc. A solo, "There were ninety and nine," was beautifully rendered by Mr. Murray.

Mrs. Sutherland MacKay offered prayer for missionary, Miss Evelyn Ricker. The Christian Friendship secretary, Miss Harriet Glover, reported 22 cards sent, 17 Home and six Hospital Calls made during the month. The Supply secretary, Mrs. Harland Day, read a letter of thanks from the Protestant Social Welfare office for parcel received. The next meeting is to be held at the home of Mrs. Leeland Mayne when the Auxiliary will entertain the Baby Band and mothers. Roll-call is to be answered by a verse of scripture beginning with the letter "A". An interesting feature of the program was a talk by Mrs. Alexander MacKay in which she told of the unique beginning of the Auxiliary—as the project came before the organization. In 1909, Dr. A.D. MacKenzie, then a missionary in Trinidad, published a letter in "The Record" telling of the great need for children's clothing. Mrs. Hugh MacKay, due to family connections, was especially interested and contacted several of the ladies of the congregation. They met on different occasions during the winter and under the leadership of Miss Rebecca Mayne, made a box of children's clothing. From this project, the interest in missionary work increased and on July 6, 1909, Miss Lena Murray, daughter of the pastor, organized the auxiliary. A note-worthy event in the young auxiliary was the conducting of a service of Worship in the church, for at this time women did not take their place in public worship as they do now. Another project of the society was the Ice Cream Social, when folks came for miles in a "Horse and Buggy," not only for the delicious home-made ice cream and cake, but for the sociable hours which such gatherings provided.
