THE CAMPAIGN IN INDIA.

**A Lively Engagement in Which
The British Lose Fifty Men.**

TRIBESMEN CONCEALED IN THE HILLS

**Followed the British Troops With a
Deadly Fire.**

SIMLA, Nov. 11.—Official despatches received here from the British camp, in the Madan Valley, tell of a reconnaissance in force by the British, and a movement as commanded by General Westcott.

The British force engaged consisted of the Dorsetshire regiment, the Northamptonshires, a regiment of Sikhs and two batteries of artillery. This column moved on Tuesday to Soran Sar, and reached the summit of the mountain with little resistance. There the troops found a hastily evacuated camp and soon after retired upon the main body.

This movement, however, was attended by serious losses to the British. The insurgent tribesmen followed after the column in strong force; swarming from behind rocks, showing wonderful audacity and keeping up a heavy fire at short range upon the British troops. Only the admirable disposition made by General Westcott of his troops saved the rear guard. The loss of the British is about fifty men. Of this number, the Northamptonshire regiment lost Lieut. Waddell and four men killed and Lieut. McIntyre and twelve men missing; the Northamptonshires also had Lieut. Trent and thirty men wounded. The Dorsetshire regiment had Lieut. Ingram and Lieut. Meur and six men wounded.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 9.—The government of the Northwest Territories announces its intention of building a road from Fort Assiniboine to Peace River, and make the best route to the Yukon.

LONDON, Nov. 9.—The birthday of the Prince of Wales was celebrated today in England with the usual flag hoisting, bell ringing and artillery salutes. He was born Nov. 9, 1894.

MANAGUA, Nov. 9.—An official despatch from the province of Matanzas, announces the surrender there to the Spanish authorities of an insurgent force consisting of three officers and 15 privates, who delivered up 30 carbines.

LEAD, S. D., Nov. 9.—There is a very heavy snow storm in the northern hills. Reports from the Northwest cattle range are that the cattle have suffered considerable. Cattle on the way to Bellefourche to be shipped will be affected worst.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Laurier and Davies, of the Canadian government, arrived here today. The British ambassador and staff will call on them tomorrow morning and later the ambassador will escort Laurier and Davies to the White House for a call of courtesy.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Mrs. Nack has confessed the murder of Golden's apprentice. She induced him to go to a house and sent him upstairs where Thorne shot him. They then cut him to pieces and threw the pieces in the river.

ST. JOHN, Nov. 9.—The 3-year old son of Mrs. William Ingrahame, living on Carmarthen street, swallowed some carbolic acid from a bottle this morning before his mother was up. He died at 9 o'clock. The father is in Boston, undergoing hospital treatment.

BERLIN, Nov. 9.—A man named Lange, who for twenty years has been Prince Bismarck's head forester in the Sackeburg, and who was pensioned last summer has begun suit against the Prince to enforce the payment of an additional pension which the ex-chancellor refused to grant him.

HAVANA, Nov. 9.—Captain-General Blanco has issued a circular to the Spanish military commanders in the different provinces of Cuba, instructing them to favor the owners of sugar estates by all means in their power, and to encourage those who may be less disposed than others to grind their cane. The Captain General is desirous that sugar cane grinding should proceed on a larger scale.

SIMLA, Nov. 9.—The report that a native officer and 35 Sikhs belonging to the Kurman column had been intercepted by tribesmen and slaughtered is officially confirmed. They were assisting in a reconnaissance up the Kurman river. Taking a short cut down hill they came to a ravine where the grass of the jungle was burning. The flames spread so rapidly as to completely cut off their retreat, and the tribesmen, seeing their predicament, swarmed on the higher ground, hurled down rocks upon them and closed round the men until the whole 36 were shot or cut down. The Sikhs fought heroically until the very last, their officer killing two rebel chiefs with his own hands before he fell.

CAPTOWN, Nov. 9.—Toto, one of the chief leaders of the insurgent of Bechuanaland, has been sentenced to six years imprisonment at hard labor and 500 others have been sentenced to terms of imprisonment varying from two to four years. They all pleaded guilty of sedition.
