A Bye Law to prevent children being on the streets after a certain hour at night. Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlotteville as follows:

1st. That boys and girls under the apparent age of sixteen years respectively shall not be on the streets of Charlotteville without proper guardianship after the hour of 8.15 p. m.

2nd. Fifteen minutes before 8.15 p. m. from the first day of November till the first day of May, and after the hour of 9.15 p. m. from the first day of May till the first day of November, the town bell shall be rung as a warning for all children under the said age to leave the streets and go to their homes.

3rd. Any parent or guardian may on complaint of any police constable or other peace officer be summoned to appear before the Stipendiary Magistrate for the City of Charlotteville to permit his or her child or children to be taken into custody.

4th. The Bye-Law shall not apply to children of the streets after the said hour of 8.15 p. m. under proper control and guardianship for some unavoidable cause.
