Growing Conditions Ideal In Maritimes

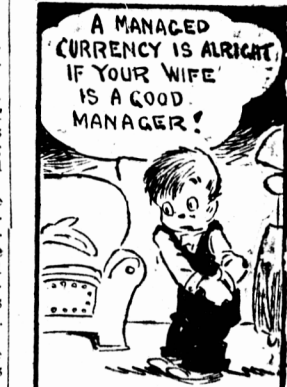
