

U.K. Dismisses Russian Threat

LONDON (AP) — The Churchill government Tuesday dismissed Russia's threat to scrap the 1942 Anglo-Soviet treaty of mutual assistance if Britain ratifies the Paris agreements for rearming Western Germany.

The foreign office, responding less than 12 hours after receiving the Russian note, issued a statement declaring:

"Her Majesty's government will continue to pursue their chosen policy of consolidating Western European unity."

British officials said the Kremlin's threat could only have the effect of speeding up the final executive ratification of the Paris accords which already have won British parliamentary approval.

REJECTED BY FRANCE

France's Premier Mendes-France last week rejected a similar warning from the Russians that ratifica-

tion would mean an end to the French-Soviet treaty of 1945. British observers believe popular French resentment against the Soviet move has enhanced chances that France's legislators will approve the accords.

The British statement said: "Her Majesty's government would much regret if the Anglo-Soviet treaty of 1942, to which they have always attached importance, were to be cancelled or annulled by the Soviet government."

"At the same time they deplore both the manner and the context in which that government now threatens such annulment. They cannot accept the argument used in the Soviet note. There is no justification for the Soviet contention that the Paris agreements are incompatible with the treaty."

Russia's wartime treaty with France, provided for mutual military aid in the event of a post-war revival of German aggression.

parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leonard McNeill.

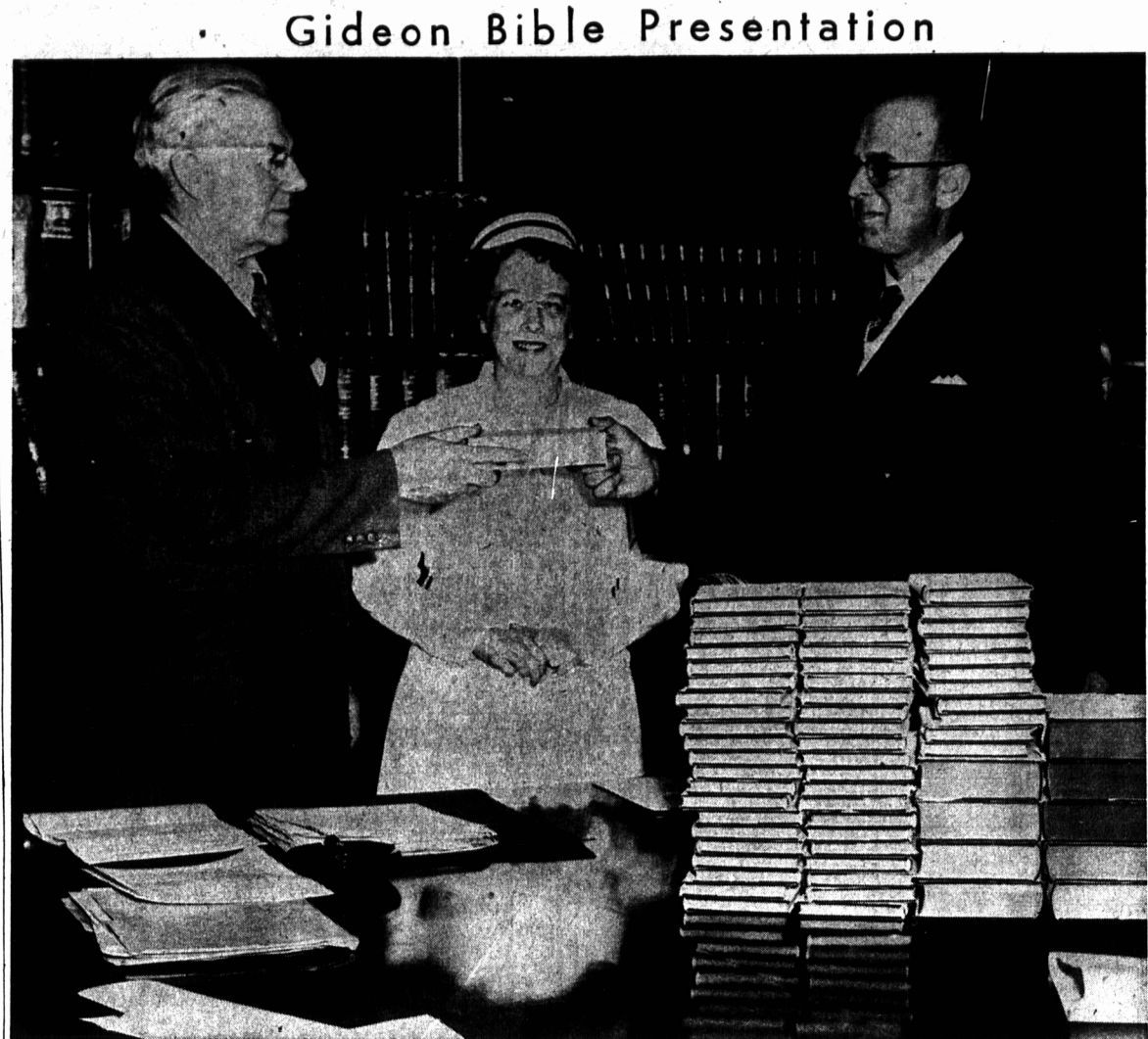

ENGLEWOOD, N. J. (AP)—Alexis Thompson, 43-year-old steel fortune heir and ex-owner of the Philadelphia Eagles professional football team, was found dead Monday a few feet from the porch in his apartment.

Police said he apparently had suffered a heart attack and groped for the telephone to call for aid. Before he could reach it, he crumpled up in the hallway of his luxurious apartment.

At the age of 14, he came into a \$3,500,000 steel fortune. Thompson was the grandson of Alexis Thompson, founder of the Republic Iron and Steel Company.
