## NEW YORK

**NEW YORK (AP)** - The stock market closed irregularly lower Wednesday.

Rails, which have been about the worst sufferers from the 14-week steel strike, showed more optimism than the industrial and managed to close a bit higher on average.

U.S. Steel closed with a gain of 1/4 by the close, most leading steelmakers were still showing mixed signs. Lighthouses, the specialty steel producer, was up 1/2.

Other bright spots were provided by space-age stocks and by Studebaker-Packard and American Motors which continued to lead the market in activity and pushed further gains. Meanwhile, General Motors, up 1/4, was the only one of the big three automakers to show a plus sign.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 20 cents to \$221.20. Volume was 2,730,000 shares.

On the Canadian list, Aluminium Ltd. lost 1/4, Dome Mines 1/4 and Walker Godeharder 1/4. Distillers Seagrams and Hudson Bay Mining 1/4 each. International Nickel gained 1/4 and McIntyre Porcupine 1/4.

American Stock Exchange prices were mixed. Volume was 3,000 shares. Among gainers were Fairchild Camera, New Jersey Zinc and Crowell-Collier.

**TORONTO (CP)** - Fresh buying in the closing minutes today created a moderate rally on the stock market to halt a two-session decline and give most sections a slightly higher tone.

## WOMEN'S CUSTODIAN

**COLOMBO, Ceylon (AP)** - Ceylon's only woman cabinet member, Mrs. Vimala Wijewardene, 51, was fired Tuesday and ousted from the government's coalition in parliament.

Political sources implied the wealthy widow was a casualty of popular feeling over the assassination of 25 of prime minister Solomon Bandaranaike, a man she had occasionally criticized.

This development may bring on a national election. Her ouster cut the government's majority to two in the 96-seat House of Representatives. With two government MPs out of the country, in India and Australia, an opposition motion of no confidence comes up next month.

Mrs. Wijewardene, widely known for her efforts with Bandaranaike, was dismissed as minister of local government and housing little more than three weeks after he was cut down by a gunman in the robes of a Buddhist monk.

Bandaranaike's successor, Prime Minister Wijayananda Dahanayake, fired her when she refused to resign.

**CALL ELECTION**

The prime minister said if the government is defeated on the confidence issue he will call a new election.

There was no official disclosure of the reason for the ouster. But usually a reliable political

source said it stemmed from a belief there was public resentment against Mrs. Wijewardene over her differences with Bandaranaike. He was a popular leader whose death shocked the Ceylonese people.

These informants said Dahanayake fired her under pressure from 11 of the 14 other cabinet ministers and some government backbenchers who felt that Mrs. Wijewardene's association with her imperilled their own political futures.
