### Russia Planned For Plot

TOKYO — Communist China has accused the Soviet Union of marshaling tens of thousands of Chinese for a political Trojan horse uprising aimed at overthrowing the Chinese district government in Sinkiang province in Russia's central Asian border.

The Chinese reported the alleged plot in broadsheets today and said that the Soviet Union's actions have brought relations between the two countries "to the brink of split."

Differences in the international Communist movement, said the Peking radio, have reached a new stage of unprecedented gravity.

A broadcast monitored here said the Russian government is planning to overthrow the Chinese local government at Hui, a district bordering the Soviet Union in northwest Sinkiang province. It said the incident took place in April and May, 1962.

The radio said the Chinese were "alarmed" or "threatened" to induce them to join a plot by Soviet officials in Sinkiang under order of the Soviet Communist party. It gave no other details of the alleged plot except to say that Chinese government had made several requests to the Russian government for the return of the Chinese and had been refused.

**NOT SETTLED**  
The matter has not been settled, it added.

The radio quoted an article jointly published by the editorial July 15 issued by the Communist Re Flag.

The statement expressed Moscow's indignation over the fact that China was trying to set up new world headquarters for communism in Peking and split the world along racial lines.

The article also claimed that for a time during the 1960 Russian suggestions, "but intended to adopt a policy of capitulation and abandon socialist Hungary's counter-revolutionary efforts."

The Chinese Communist party at that time reportedly opposed these erroneous methods, but advanced correct suggestions.

The Russian leaders, it said, "have advanced correct suggestions, but subsequent event showed that they nursed anger against the Chinese Communist party."

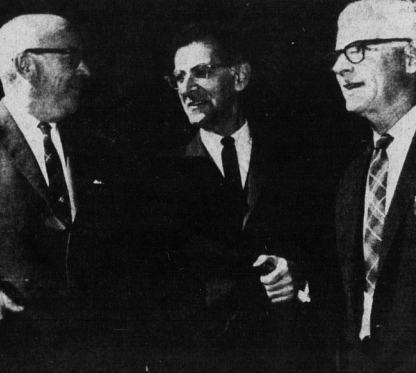

# Ottawa Pays 90 Per Cent Of Borden-Bonshaw Miles Be Improved



## Miles Be Improved

The federal government has agreed to pay 90 per cent of the cost of making approximately 22 miles of the Trans Canada Highway, running from Borden to Bonshaw, into an all-weather road. Hon. Jean Paul Deschatelets, federal minister of public works, announced in Charlottetown yesterday.

He was in the province meeting with provincial government officials and visiting the federal public works offices in Charlottetown.

**CONTRACTS LET**  
Last month the provincial department of highways awarded three contracts, of 7.5 miles each, to improve the Borden-Bonshaw section of the Trans Canada Highway. The whole section will be repaved, shoulders widened and extra passing lanes constructed on hills.

Total value of the three paving contracts is approximately \$715,125.

Mr. Deschatelets spent several hours with Highway Minister Philip Matheson discussing provincial highway problems. Mr. Deschatelets said "views of all provinces relative to the Trans Canada highway are being considered." He suggested that project (Continued on page 2, col. 4)
