THE NORTH POLE.

Latest Scheme for Reaching it.

St. PETERSBURG, Oct. 16.—A new scheme that exceeds in wildness of conception the most novel of all the extraordinary plans of scientists, cranks and lunatics for reaching the North Pole has just been sprung on the public by Admiral Makaroff, the well known explorer of the Northern Pacific. His plan is nothing more or less than to force a way to the pole through the intervening fields and mountains of ice by means of a fleet of "ice-breakers." It is declared by Admiral Makaroff that the ice that shields the pole could be forced with a ten thousand horse power ice breaker, and he even goes so far as to assert that with two ice breakers of ten thousand horse power he could force a pathway to the pole in 12 days. The ice breakers that the admiral proposes to use in his attempts to reach the pole are to be modelled on the same lines as the steam ice crushers that are familiar to visitors at the port of Vladivostok, where they are used to force a passage through the narrow channel which that port is blocked for two months of the year.

SWEDEN WILL BUILD A NAVY

Appropriation of \$3,752,000 Asked for Warships.

GOTHENBURG, Oct 12.—The Swedish Naval Board will recommend to the Riksdag an appropriation of \$3,752,000 for the expenses of the next two years. The Swedish navy, which consists of less than a score each of armoured and cruising vessels is maintained only for purposes of coast defence. It is desired now to increase the floating strength and to expend a considerable sum in the purchase of ammunition and torpedoes for the mining of the harbours.

KILLED BY EATING SPIDERS.

Suicide of a Woman Serving a Life Sentence for Her Father's Murder.

DES MOINES, Ia., Oct 14.—Cora Smith, who was serving a life sentence for the murder of her father, killed herself by eating live spiders. She had been trying for weeks to find a way to take her life, and seeing one day the spiders crawling on the walls of the prison yard, it occurred to her that they would serve. Sunday night she ate the spiders, and yesterday morning she was found dead in her cell. The handkerchief with the remaining spiders were found by her side. Michael Smith, the father, was a prosperous railway engineer. Because he remonstrated with the wife and daughter about the life they led, they made several attempts to kill him. His wife was convicted of his murder and sent to penitentiary for life. Shortly afterwards the daughter confessed that she, and not her mother, killed her father, and this sent her to the penitentiary for life. The mother obtained a new trial, and was again convicted a few months ago.

Great Britain and France.

PARIS, Oct. 14.—The report of Lord Rosebery's speech has attracted universal attention and caused considerable sensation in political circles, as it is regarded as confirmatory of Lord Salisbury's determination to uphold the rights of England as presented in the official correspondence published October 10. The general opinion of Frenchmen is that the speech does not improve the situation from their point of view.

Mr Delfosse, the Royal leader, in a letter published in the Gaulois, says that at the conclusion of the China-Japanese war, France unhesitatingly assisted Russia, and the time has now come for Russia to repay that service by helping France against England. It is evident, he says, that it should be necessary for England to go to war, France would be helpless alone. Russia is the only power that can contemplate war with England with serenity, for she is invulnerable.

Paris Strike Situation.

PARIS, Oct 14.—The number of men returning to work was greatly increased this morning and the meetings of the strikers were poorly attended. In fact the strike of the laborers employed by the building trades is considered ended.


