

Reviews Activities Of P.E.I. Historical Society

Since the last annual meeting of the Historical Society of Prince Edward Island a great deal of work has been done by the society and considerable ground work with a view to the establishment of a Provincial Museum, reported the retiring president, Mr. Justice G. J. Tweedy, at Monday's annual meeting.

At the July meeting it was decided that, due to lack of funds, no historical exhibit would be arranged for the year 1954 but that concentrated efforts would be put forth for a worthy exhibit during Centennial Year.

A delegation waited on the Premier and a brief was presented requesting assistance, financial and otherwise, for the society. No grant, however, was received for the year 1954. A committee comprising Justice H. L. Palmer, A. W. Gaudet and Mrs. William Brehaut was appointed to prepare a constitution and by-laws. Appreciation was also expressed to the Charlottetown Board of Trade for their offer to finance the expense of the Historical Exhibit for 1954.

At the November meeting there was an unusually large number present, representative of the whole Province. The constitution and by-laws were approved and will be submitted for consideration and approval.

A committee was appointed to prepare and present to the Government a brief for assistance. Mr. F. A. S. Jones, who is chairman of the Centennial Tour Committee dealing with historical events, outlined the plans of his committee for an Historical Tour of the City during Centennial Year. The co-operation of the Society was assured. Mr. Jones and his committee. Plans were also discussed for the Historical Exhibit during 1955.

At the January meeting of the society the committee appointed to wait on the Government reported that sufficient interest was shown and sufficient number of members received, the Government would consider sympathetically a request for a grant in the future.

"Perhaps the highlight of the year," reported President Tweedy, "was the visit of Captain Armit, Curator of the Halifax Citadel Museum, who addressed a dinner meeting on March 26th. At this dinner we were very proud to have His Honour the Lieut.-Governor, the Premier and the Mayor present as our guests, together with a group of citizens representative of the Province.

"Captain Armit while in the Province inspected several possible sites for a museum and had no hesitation in recommending the ground and mezzanine floors of the present Post Office Building as a very suitable location for a Provincial Museum if and when available.

"The thanks of the Society are freely extended to CFCY for the time given to our various speakers on historical subjects, and also to the press for publishing same, a report on which will be given by our secretary Mrs. Brehaut. The speakers, too, deserve much credit for the time and energy spent in preparing the material for and delivering these addresses. We know that these addresses created the widespread interest in the work of the Society. Requests came not only from within the Province but also from without for copies of the various addresses.

Credit Unions Wait On Gov't

OTTAWA (CP) — Representatives of Canadian co-operatives and credit unions Wednesday asked that credit unions be enabled to make government-guaranteed loans to fishermen.

They appeared before the Commons banking committee, studying a bill that would enable banks to make government-guaranteed loans to fishermen of up to \$4,000 at five per cent interest for a maximum of eight years.

Briefs were presented from the National Co-operative Fisheries Association, Ottawa; the New Brunswick Federation des Caisses Populaires Acadiennes, Caraquet, N.B.; the Nova Scotia Credit Union League, Antigonish, N.S.; and the Credit Union League of the province of British Columbia, Vancouver.

Argentine Peso Continues Decline

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay (AP)—The Argentine peso, which has been dropping in free exchange rate quotations in Montevideo for two weeks, has dipped still lower since last Thursday's revolt against the Peron government.

Monday's quotation put the peso at 34.37 to the U.S. dollar. The rate 10 days ago was 32.35 pesos. The decline started as the Peron regime's dispute with the church resumed headed for a climax.

The official exchange rate in Buenos Aires is never more than 14 pesos to the dollar.
