Fishermen Blunder Into School Of Killer Whales

VICTORIA (CP) — To Victoria fishermen out after salmon had five nerve-racking minutes when a school of killer whales turned up.

Frank Porter and John Blackey were fishing from a 15-foot canoe with an outboard motor when about 20 whales weighing approximately five tons each, appeared round their boat.

"I never met with such a hair-raising experience," said Mr. Porter. "The whales were all around and under us. We pulled out of the school just in time."

The adventure began when Mr. Blackey got a strike and began to reel his salmon in. The fish was about five feet from the canoe when someone in a nearby boat shouted: "Pull in your line quickly."

As Mr. Blackey jerked in his line he saw the fin of a whale near his canoe. The canoe rose out of the water but came down on an even keel.

Meanwhile, Mr. Porter saw a killer whale take his salmon line and sinker.

"We suddenly realized we were surrounded by killers," he said. "The boat heaved a few times and some of the whales passed underneath."

"Then they started to circle as if they were about to make a general attack. We raced out of the danger area."

Charles Guiget, museum biologist, said killer whales when irritated have been known to attack boats and kill men

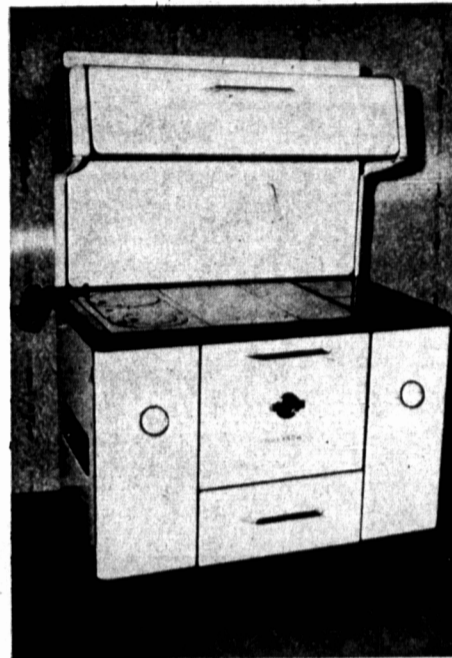

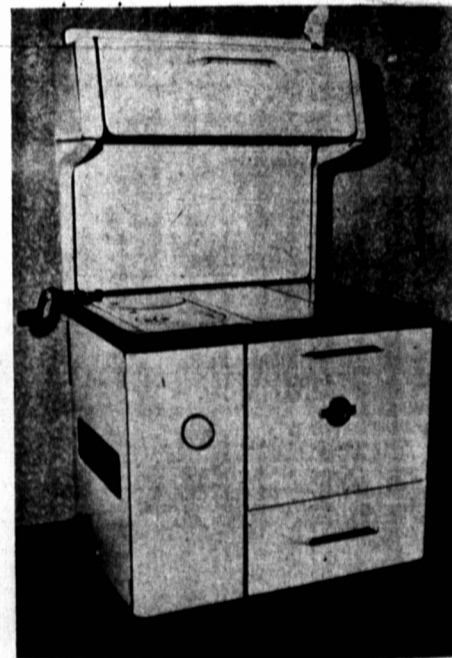

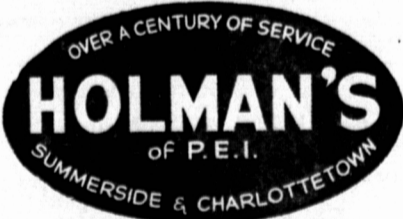
