New Deal Planned On Cheese

WOODSTOCK, Ont. (CP)—Agriculture Minister, Hamilton said Tuesday the federal government is working on a new deal which will benefit cheese producers.

Mr. Hamilton refused to elaborate at a Progressive Conservative rally, saying that if he makes an announcement during the April 8 election campaign, opposition parties will accuse him of trying to bribe the voters.

"All I can say is that I feel it will offer enough encouragement to divert some of the milk production from other areas."

He suggested that if the type of milk now is used for many products in the world market, where flour prices and ceiling is set by agreement among a number of nations, can be extended to milk, cheese, sugar and similar agricultural goods so we can give a reasonably fair price to all of them.

300 Somalis Demonstrate

SIOLO, Kenya (Reuters)—More than 300 Somalis shouting "Europeans get out!" Tuesday demonstrated outside the British provincial commissioner's office here.

They were protesting against the British government's decision to refuse to permit this predominantly Somali section of Kenya to secede from the colony and join the neighboring South Africa.

The British decision led to the government threatening to break off diplomatically with the British government, which was expected shortly with Britain and there was pressure on the government to sever relations with the United States, France and Ethiopia as well.

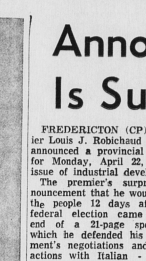

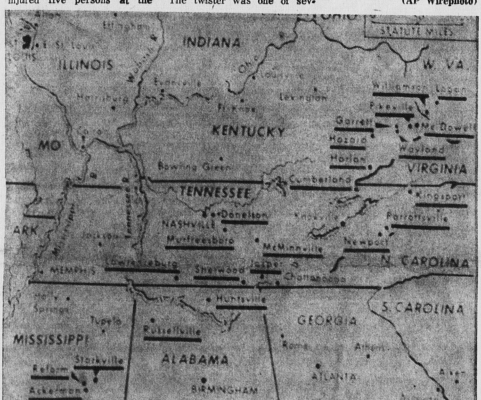
