Attorney-General Guest Speaker At Kinsmen Meeting

Attorney-General W. E. Darby, K.C., was the guest speaker at the regular meeting of the Kinsmen Club of Summerside last evening at the Olympia. He gave a very informative talk on the problems that beset the Dominion and the Provinces in their endeavour to find a way to amend the Canadian constitution.

At the beginning he explained that Canada operates under a Federal system with powers divided between the Dominion Parliament and Provincial Legislatures. He explained how Confederation came about, how the powers were divided at that time and how, in later years, conflicts in regard to jurisdiction grew up.

He gave as one instance how unemployment insurance could not be put into force without an amendment to the British North America Act. Mr. Darby said it is now necessary to evolve some more workable system. For instance social security schemes are based on agreements between the Provinces and the Dominion and it will eventually be necessary to amend the constitution to place all social security under the Dominion Government.

Mr. Darby said that labor legislation is a matter of Provincial jurisdiction and disgressing from his main theme for the minute he said that if the railway strike had not ended when it did the P.E.I. Legislature, in the mood that its members were in at the time, might have passed legislation banning unions in the Province or prohibiting local unions any connection with outside the Province. This, however, would not be proper attitude to labor in general, he said.

He outlined many of the difficulties that come up when efforts are made to amend the constitution. But Canada is a sovereign nation and she now feels she should be able to amend her own constitution and some method will have to be found which will allow any part of the constitution to be amended with satisfaction to everyone.
