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Anti-Leukemic Drugs And Life

By Dr. Theodore R. Van Dellen From the Cleveland Clinic, a discussion on leukemia. It is written: "The recent death of Ernie Davis, who was a football star from Syracuse, has been a great shock to many persons, especially those who have leukemia or who have a friend or relative with the disease."

"Most persons are unable to understand why no medical aid could have been given to Davis' life, especially as he was gaining feeling the day before he died. A job requiring about the illness of this man stems from the fact there are two main types of leukemia. He had the acute variety, which is replete with complications and fatal within a short time. It differs from the chronic type, which is more frequent and less violent."

Before the advent of our modern anti-leukemia drugs, the majority with acute leukemia died within a few weeks after the disease was diagnosed. The acute variety favors hard-to-remember numerals, and the patient the more likely he is to respond to treatment. Several types of leukemia are available in elevated white cell count. The response, though temporary, protracted for a year or more, and elevated complications do not arise.

I am not familiar with details of the death of Ernie Davis, but similar stories are familiar. In leukemia frequently have complications which caused the pain, stomach, or occur at the skin. A fatal stroke may occur at any time—often a blessing in disguise.
