Veteran Judge Hasn't Seen Horse-Drawn Plow In Years

WINTERBURN, Alta. (CP)—Plowing with horses is a "work of art," but a veteran judge says he hasn't seen a horse-drawn plow in competitions for many years.

Jim Shearer, who supervises the 1,900-acre spread at the Oliver Provincial Mental Institute in suburban Edmonton, was one of the judges in the Edmonton and District Agricultural Society plowing championships on Alex Zeigler's farm near Winterburn, a few miles west of Edmonton.

"You just don't get the good, clean job from the tractor-drawn implement you did when horses were pulling the plow," Shearer said.

WORK OF ART

The judges walk many miles

and their is an exacting job. They scrutinize the crown of the land, the straightness, depth and width of the furrows, the evenness of the top, covering of weeds and how the in-and-out play at the ends has been carried out. Contestants can win 100 points, but 80 is considered excellent.

Plowmen are allowed to go down six inches.

"We allow a half-inch either way," Shearer told a reporter, "but anything outside of that and the contestant begins losing points."

Shearer and the other judge, Len Job, a farmer and top plowman in Edmonton district competitions for many years, agreed the competition is tough and the competitors skilled.

"We try to run the competitions on as classical a basis as possible yet we don't overlook a good workaday job," Shearer said.

SAY JUDGING HARDER

Job, a former contestant, contends that judging is a more difficult chore than plowing.

"When I was plowing in competitions," Job commented, "I had no one to worry about but myself. Now I have a dozen or so fellows to think about—to make sure I'm judging their work right."

The judges say the contestants don't complain about the results. "The fellows are very good," Shearer remarked. "They never come squalling to us when the results are posted. Sometimes we are asked to outline our reasons for giving certain marks but that's all."

Russians Cut Costs Levied On East Germany

MOSCOW (Reuters) — Russia Tuesday announced a 50-per-cent cut in the costs paid by the East German government toward maintenance of Soviet troops in East Germany.

The two states also declared that the only way to reunite Germany is through direct negotiations between West and East Germany.

The maintenance cut, which comes into effect next Jan. 1, will reduce East Germany's occupation support contribution from 1,600,000,000 marks (about \$400,000,000).

A communique issued after talks here between East German Premier Otto Grottel and Soviet leaders also said Russia will send substantially increased shipments of goods to help fulfill the East German second five-year plan.

Mental Tests Ordered In Murder Case

HAMPTON, N.B. (CP) — Edward Patterson McKinney was charged with murder in Kings county police court Tuesday and ordered committed to hospital for mental examination.

The 35-year-old principal of the Southampton, York county, regional school was accused in an information laid by RCMP of murdering his wife, Vera Mae McKinney, found dead in their summer home at Public Landing on the St. John River July 8. An inquest jury Friday ruled she died of strangulation.

Eric L. Teed of Saint John appeared for McKinney and called Dr. E. C. Menzies of Norton, former superintendent of the provincial mental hospital in Lancaster.

Dr. Menzies testified he believed McKinney was mentally ill and felt strongly that his mental and emotional condition should be investigated further at a place where he could be properly observed.

Magistrate G. King Kelley recorded McKinney's plea of not guilty and committed him to the provincial hospital for 23 days.

He is to appear here again Aug. 9.

East Nigeria's Premier Quits

LONDON (AP) — The Negro prime minister of East Nigeria Tuesday announced his resignation after accusing Britain's colonial secretary of insults, antagonism and interference.

The explosive dispute, which could block Nigeria's march to independence, blew up over British objections to the West African government's banking and financial practices.

Premier Nnamdi Azikiwe, who heads the East Nigerian government, said in a cable to Colonial Secretary A. T. Lennox-Boyd: "My humble advice is that you be careful not to mess up affairs of Eastern Nigeria as in the case of Cyprus and Singapore. We are ready for any eventuality and will not stand nonsense from anybody. You have been warned."

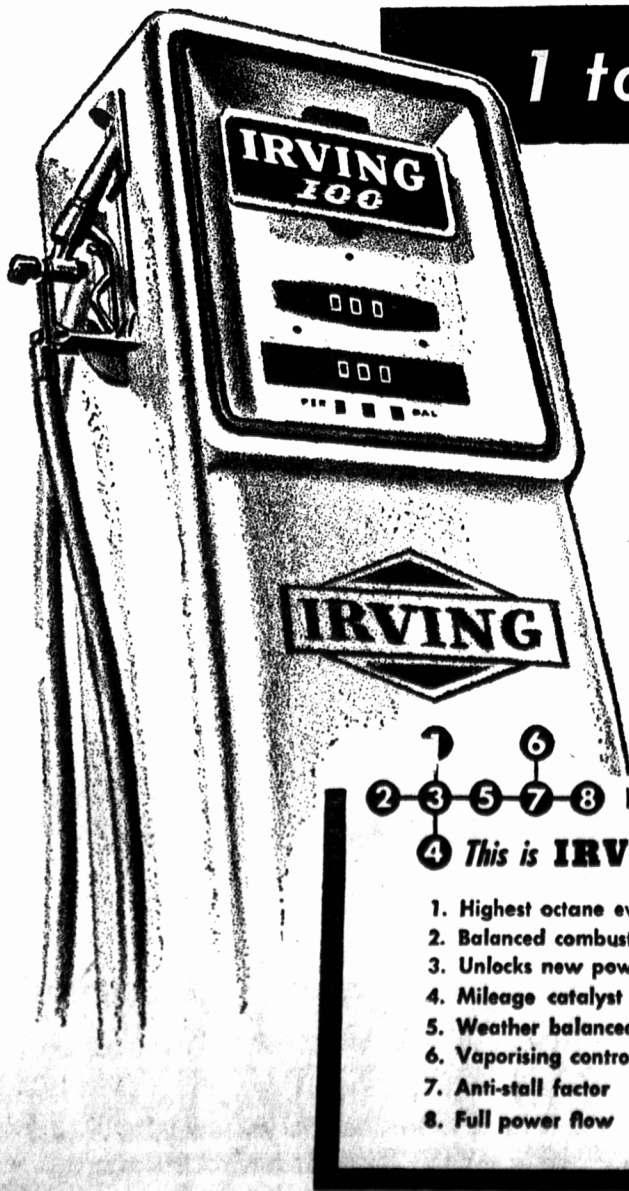
