MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP)—The market was easier at the close of moderate trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Wednesday.
 But papers and banks showed a stronger tendency. Great Lakes Paper improved 1/2 to 30 1/2. Bathurst B at 18 1/2 was up 1/2 and one-point gains were registered by Bank of Commerce at 49 and Toronto-Dominion Bank at 45.
 Changes in the construction issues ranged from a 1/2-point gain by S. Lawrence Cement A at 15 to a 1/4-point drop by Dominion Bridge at 22 1/2.
 Other industrial groups were generally lower. Nickel dipped 1/2 to 77. Losses of one point were taken by Ford A at 86, and Asbestos at 30. Molson A slipped 1/2 to 37 1/2.
 On the rise were Dofasco, up 1/2 to 30 and Consumers' Gas at 32 and Quebec Telephone at 26, each up 1/2.
 In an easier producing mines group Campbell Chibougamau slipped 20 cents to 5.80. But a gain of 30 cents was shown by Quebec Lithium at 4.30.
 According to the closing averages, banks were up .47 at a new high of 51.11, utilities off .6 at 142.4, industrials off .4 at 264.4, combined off .5 at 223.7, papers up 1.1 at 375.7 and golds unchanged at 74.98.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market backed away from its latest series of 1958 highs as turnover slackened a bit Wednesday, but motors and other selected issues did well.
 The number of issues traded totaled 1,214, making Wednesday's the broadest market since Jan. 16 and the second broadest of the year.
 The market was mixed at the start but a lower tendency asserted itself and tilted the balance downward. Steels, most base metals, chemicals, aircrafts, oils and rails were on the losing side.
 The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 70 cents to \$174.70.
 U.S. Steel lost 1/4 as the most active stock in its section.
 Canadian issues traded all lost ground by the close. Aluminum Limited was down 3/4, Canadian Pacific 1/2. Distillers-Seagrams 1/2, Dome Mines 1/4, Granby Mining 1/2, Hudson Bay Mining 3/4, International Nickel 1/2 and McIntyre Porcupine 1/2.
 Among Canadian issues traded on the American Stock Exchange Eureka gained 1/2 while Molybdenite and Prestin East Dome lost 1-1/2. Fargo Oil was down 1/2.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—The stock market suffered its first complete setback in three weeks Wednesday as all sections dipped in moderate trading.
 Final volume of 3,306,000 shares was down considerably from Tuesday's 4,035,000.
 Base metals gained almost four points Tuesday and Wednesday but profit-taking finally caught up. Almost all senior mines were lower in a 1/2-point range. Consolidated Mining and Falconbridge were exceptions, ahead fractions. Uranium were lower as Consolidated Denison dipped 1/2 at 15 1/2 and Gunnar 1/2 at 19 1/2.
 Golds, ahead in early trading, lost headway at noon but almost all issues recovered in closing trading, though gains were small. McIntyre, losing 1/4 at 79 1/2, kept the index down.
 Western oils failed in another attempt to move forward and profit-taking chipped fractions of many of the senior issues.
 Index losses: Golds .02 to 85.16; base metals .58 to 161.44; western oils .43 to 135.68.
