Conservative Party
In Britain Readies
For Snap Election

LONDON, Feb. 3 — (Reuters)
The Conservative Party is pre-
paring against the chance of a
snap general election — confident
that its leader, Winston Churchill,
will return to 10 Downing Street
as prime minister if Britain's vot-
ers are called for an early verdict.
A large section of rank and file
opinion on both sides of parlia-
ment thinks an election possible
before summer. The last election,
in February, 1950, saw Labor re-
turned with a small majority.
Many Conservatives say socialist
prestige is falling rapidly in the
country but that Prime Minister
Attlee's administration will stay
in office as long as it can. Pub-
lic opinion polls — usually an ac-
curate barometer here — indicate
that Labor would be defeated in
an election now.

The impression gained from So-
cialist ministerial quarters is that
the Labor Government will not
dissolve parliament unless political
obstacles make it impossible to
carry on.
The Government's strongest weapon
in exacting obedience from its
small but rebellious left-wing min-
ority is the threat of a general
election. Few Socialist critics are
prepared to face the charge that
they helped to "bring back the
Tories."

Chief factor likely to provoke
Attlee into an election is another
series of "crisis" votes on issues
before the House of Commons,
such as he fought last year, sav-
ing his government from defec-
tion with the aid of invalids and bed-
ridden members who crawled out
to bolster the party vote.
Conservatives suggested that
another vista of such challenges
would convince the Prime Min-
ister it is impossible to govern
under such conditions. An ad-
verse vote in Commons on a ma-
jor issue could force the govern-
ment to resign.

Churchill has a skeleton cabi-
net ready to take over Britain's
government if an election gives
him the chance to swing his
party into power.
Observers believe it is to be
on the following lines:
Foreign Secretary — Anthony
Eden.

Chancellor of the Exchequer —
Oliver Lyttleton (former Produc-
tion Minister) or Richard Austen
Butler (former Education Minis-
ter).
Lord President of the Council —
Lord Woolton, Britain's war-
time Food Minister.
Defence Minister — Harold
MacMillan (former Air Secretary).
Commonwealth Relations Min-
ister and House of Lords Leader —
The Marquess of Salisbury.
Lord Chancellor — Sir David
Maxwell-Fyfe.
Attorney-General — Sir Walter
Monckton.
Lord Privy Seal — William S.
Morrison (former Town Plan-
ning Minister).
Health Minister — Walter El-
liott, a former occupant of that
post.
Education Minister — Richard
Lawson, son of former prime minis-
ter Bonar Law.
Agriculture Minister — Robert
Hudson.
