CONCEDE WHAT YOU MUST

It is remarkable how many hands can be made by declarer's early concession of a trick that he will have to lose in any case.

Bridge bidding chart showing South, West, North, East positions and card counts.

The bidding: South 1♠, West 4♥, North Pass, East Pass.

West, with seven sure tricks and 150 honors, felt that some pushing of the vulnerable opponents was in order.

As matters turned out, however, West did not have to do any further bidding. He laid down the king and queen of hearts.

Admitting, for the sake of argument, that South had reason to feel confident about the diamond position, it still would have been a very good idea to use a plan that had a good chance no matter what the diamond king.

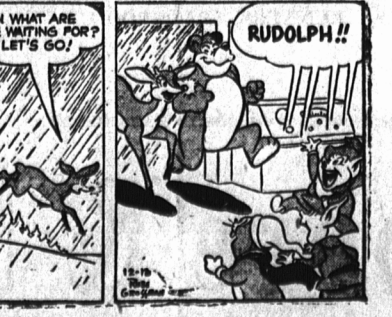
