TO COMPLETE CONTRACT —The firm of Noye and Rayner expects to complete its contract today on the present Montague bridge as workmen remove the last part of the steel superstructure standing here since 1912. During the time the firm has been here, it has constructed a temporary bridge across the river, erected an understructure to the present bridge, and has almost completed the removal of the steel superstructure. This means that the way is now clear for the construction of the new bridge. Although the contract has not been let, it is hoped that the construction will begin in the not too distant future.
