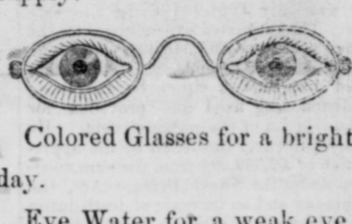

Sir,—The question to be decided on Thursday is not, as the supporters of the Scott Act maintain, a question of the Scott Act vs. Free Rum, or it is the Scott Act vs. every other system, and the verdict in favor of the Act, cannot be revised, or even changed, for Prohibition for the next three years. Free Rum is entirely out of the question. The Free Rum system of 1891 only lasted a little over a year. In 1892 the authorities took official cognizance of the liquor traffic and passed the present existing Liquor Regulation Act. The present system is a license system, for a license is a permission to do certain things upon certain conditions. The present act permits the sale of spirituous liquors during certain hours upon certain conditions. Therefore the present system is a license system, although to please certain people fees are demanded for the permit. A liquor dealer's money, it appears, is blood money, an unclean thing, and cannot be put into the treasury under the name of tax, but call it fine, and, like Naaman, when he dipped in Jordan, the leprosy disappears. If the Scott Act itself could get dipped in the waters of oblivion, so that its evil effects no longer be remembered, it might have some chance of being carried; nothing but the waters of the mystical Lethe could eradicate from it the sweeping condemnation pronounced by His Lordship Judge Henley, when he gave his memorable testimony: "A frightful amount of perjury was engendered by the Scott Act."

SOME PERTINENT QUESTIONS ON THE SCOTT ACT.

Sir,—(1) The Canada Temperance Act has been before the country 16 years. Can the advocates of this Act name any one city in the Dominion of Canada where it has been even fairly successfully enforced during that time? And if not, what likelihood is there of it now being successfully enforced in Charlottetown, where it has already been declared a failure?

(2) The Scott Act has been deferred 51 times; in no one instance has it ever been re-introduced on appeal after such defeat. If this act tended to promote temperance would this be the case, since the temperance movement is increasing rapidly in Canada?

(3) There are 138 counties in eastern Canada. At one time the act was in force in nearly half of these, now it is in force only in 30. Why this sweeping rejection by those counties where the majority of electors are in favor of Prohibition and could therefore carry the Scott Act if they considered it effective in suppressing the drink traffic?

(4) It is claimed that the Government is pledged against the License Act and therefore in the event of the Scott Act being defeated, we can look for no improvement in the present law. But must this necessarily follow? If the majority of the electors desire to carry the Scott Act, will the Government refuse their request? Can they not limit the number of places where liquor is sold? In a word, can they not pass a bill in every way as stringent as the license act, except that no money is taken from the liquor seller.

(5) The statistics show that the convictions for drunkenness in this city have decreased steadily since the Act was repealed. Can any of the ministers state that there is more drinking among members of their congregations than there was under the Act? And if not, what conclusions are we to draw from this?
