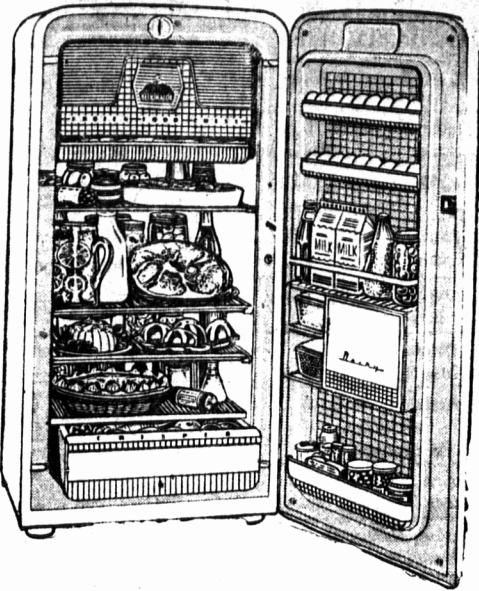

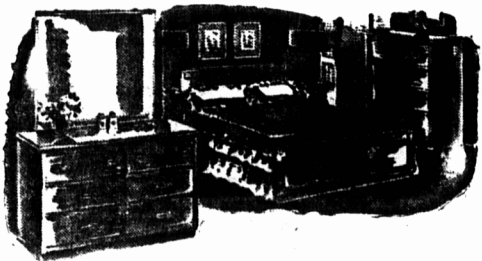

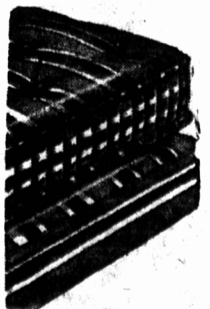

AGRICULTURAL NEWS

P. E. I. Department of Agriculture

This year will mark one of the greatest advances in the organization of Artificial Breeding Clubs in this Province. Eight new clubs have been organized and commenced operation since the first of May. Several thousands cows will be bred artificially during this year.

In the bull stud that is maintained at Fredericton, New Brunswick there are forty-seven bulls representing seven different breeds. The various breeds represented are Holsteins, Ayrshire, Jersey, Guernsey, Dual Purpose, Short-horn, Beef Shorthorn, and Hereford. These animals are of high quality, with good milk production and butter fat records.

The clubs which are in operation at the present time are the O'Leary and District, Eastern Prince County, Kensington and District, York and District, Montague and District and Eastern Kings Artificial Breeding Clubs. NEW CL.

The Kensington and District Artificial Breeding Club commenced operation last Monday. This club will include the area from Travelers Rest along route No. 1 through Kensington to the Granville or Rattentown road up to Stanley Bridge. In other words it includes part of Lot 19, lots 18, and 20 and a portion of lot 21.

At a meeting in Kensington on Thursday night the board of directors was selected as follows: Frank Ramsay, New London; John MacNutt, Malpeque; Earl Clark, Malpeque; Keith Warren, Margate; Crawford Sinclair, Springfield; Keith Mann, Indian River; Ivan Bowness, Norborne; George Howatt, French River; Clair Campbell, Irishtown.

Following the general meeting the new board of directors met and selected John MacNutt as president and Elmer Clark as Secretary-Treasurer.

PREPARE FOR WEEDS
If producers really knew the influence of weeds in lowering crop values, a greater measure of attention would be paid in the matter of their control. Some weeds are particularly vigorous and remove from the soil not only plant feeds but a tremendous amount of moisture that should be going in to the invigoration of the crop. In a year of moisture shortage this is a particularly serious matter. The deductions from fertility, and the stealing of high priced fertilizer ingredients from other crops, are also matter of very great importance.

Experiments have been conducted in connection with moisture and fertility diversion, and the lowering of crop yields, and the results of such experiments have indicated an alarming lowering of all factors. The prevalence on many farms, and in many sections, of wild mustard and wild radish in our grain crops, must inevitably materially reduce yields. Fortunately in the past few years the spraying of 2, 4-D on grain has become more prevalent, and the results have been outstanding. The practise should be very general for the cost of sprays under the subsidy supplied by the Provincial Department of Agriculture is not great. The subsidy is based on the acid content in the product, and on this basis a certain rate per acre is paid in the form of a subsidy.

In view of the fact that 2, 4-D products have been reduced by some manufacturers by about 20 percent in price, the cost of the material when the subsidy from the Department is paid will bring the acreage expenditure down to a very low level. Those who have difficulty with weeds of the kind mentioned early preparation in the form of a special boom for available sprayers should be taken so that the spray can be supplied at the proper time. A twenty-four foot boom will soon get over a field of grain, and it is surprising the measure of control that can be secured under the direction of a careful operator.

The total cost, in any event, is very little in comparison with the cost of having these weeds deteriorate the production and value of the grain crop. In all cases where purchases are made presentation for payment of the subsidy must come from the parties who actually use the material on their grains. A properly receipted bill of sale at be presented on which the brand name of the material must be clearly indicated. Furthermore, the material must be used on the grain crops. No subsidy is paid if it is utilized for any other purpose. Prompt application for subsidy should be made as soon as the material is used. Prepare immediately and meet the challenge of the weed invasion with this simple control remedy.

CAPONS
The caponizing of cockerels, at six weeks of age, has become popular during the last five years. Birds to be caponized should have the feed removed fifteen hours and water removed ten hours before the operating time. This starving period is very important as it gives the operator a chance to do a better job with a very small mortality.

After the operation the birds should go back into the same pen from which they came and on clean litter. To prevent crowding for the first five days after caponizing, the room temperature of the pen should be increased by about five degrees, until the birds are over the shock of the operation and are feeding normally. They should stay in that pen for at least three days, and the same feed as they were getting should be fed about two weeks after the operation; then it may be changed.

Capon raised on range on a diet of growing-mash, scratch grain and milk are superior to capons raised indoors. The confined birds can be finished at four and one-half to five months, but they do not gain same size nor weight as capons given good range, not forced, which finish at six months.
