HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says a disturbance passing south of Lake Michigan late Sunday night was moving towards the district from the southwest. By this evening the disturbance is expected to be located near Moncton. However, the cloud shield ahead of this disturbance will move over New Brunswick this morning over most of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island in the afternoon, and reach Cape Breton by late evening.

Rain showers associated with the disturbance are expected to reach New Brunswick by this evening. The strong southerly flow of milder air ahead of the disturbance will bring above freezing temperatures throughout the district today.

Regional forecasts: Halifax, South Shore, Valley, Northern Nova Scotia, Eastern Shore, Prince Edward Island. Clear with a few cloudy periods becoming cloudy this afternoon; mild; light winds increasing this afternoon to southerly 20. Low-tish at Halifax 20 and 25, Yarmouth 22 and 35, Kentville 20 and 35, New Glasgow and Goshen 20 and 33, Charlottetown 10 and 33.
