ference, has virtually accepted the Moscow theory of American aggression.

It is also significant, however, that while Moscow protested U.S. action in the area, when Chinese and Vietnamese students in Moscow stormed the American Embassy the Kremlin sent regular army troops to reinforce the police in suppressing the disturbance.

It is hard to fit these pieces into any coherent pattern. Meanwhile, fortunately, there seems to be a lull in the fighting which broke out last month.

The full-length debate which the Canada Pension Plan is receiving in the House of Commons may be annoying to the Government which is anxious to dispose of the measure as speedily as possible.

The Cape Breton Post devotes a leading editorial to commending this proposition, as beneficial to both provinces. It suggests a get-together conference to devise means for its realization.

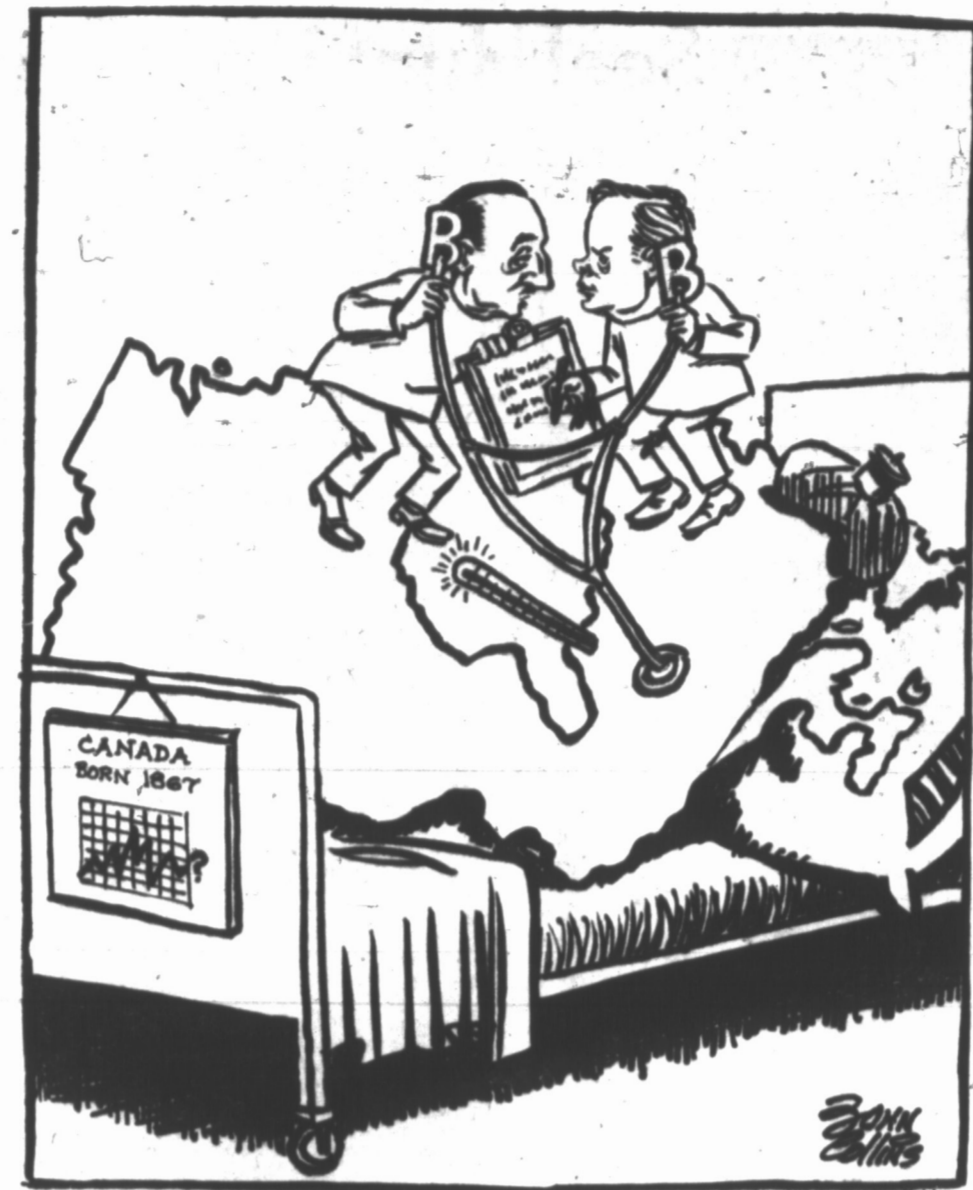

Erhard's Misfortune

Chancellor Erhard looks the victim in what might be called a tale of two hatreds—West Germany's hatred of the Communist East German regime and Arab hatred of Israel.

It is the misfortune of the jolly West German chancellor that, in a federal election year, the collision of these two hatreds have led to the crumbling of Bonn's diplomatic stance in the Middle East.

By finally proposing during the weekend to establish diplomatic relations with Israel, Erhard has risked the combined wrath of the Arab countries and caused a rift in his own coalition government as it campaigns for re-election.

CREATURE OF MOSCOW Nasser, who had accepted considerable West German aid, thus threatened the cornerstone of Bonn foreign policy, which is that only the federal government represents Germany and Ulbricht is nothing but the creature of Moscow.

One removes also the common heritage shared, up to now, by both English and French-speaking Canadians, the heritage which constitutes almost the only link between these two peoples and which has bound them together for nearly a century as a single nation.

Abolish the monarchy, and the parliamentary system of which it is the head, and offer instead a republican government with a president, and how would the Canadian differ from his American neighbor?

They differ in customs and outlook only in those Canadian institutions which reflect their British heritage: law, government, social standards and, least tangible but most important of all, loyalty to traditions many centuries old.
