MRS. ALBERT CLOW

The funeral was held on Friday morning, July 30, 1954 of Mary Ann Hayter, wife of Mr. Albert Clow of Kensington, from her late residence to St. Ann's Church, Lot 65. "In the midst of life we are in death." This quotation was surely referred to in the sudden death of Mrs. Albert Clow, which took place on July 28 at her home in Kingston at the age of 74 years. The deceased was the only daughter of the late Mr. John Hayter and Ann Cavanagh of Charlottetown. The late Mrs. Clow spent her young life in Charlottetown, and later moved to the U.S.A. where she met and married Mr. Albert Clow. Thirteen children blessed their home, where they received careful conscientious training.

Her teaching was by example, and her consolation was in seeing her children tread the narrow path. The passing of this distinguished mother and wife will be lamented in the community and home, where her life was spent diffusing sympathy and kindness. Words cannot do justice to the qualities of heart and mind that were characteristic of the late Mrs. Clow and no words could offer a personal tribute of respect to the memory of this noble and virtuous lady.

The large funeral cortege followed the remains to St. Ann's Church where Mass of Requiem was celebrated by her pastor, Rev. Fr. McCarthy, followed by the last absolutions. Then the mortal remains were conveyed to the Catholic Cemetery, Charlottetown where the service was conducted by her pastor. She is survived by her husband, three daughters and six sons; the children are: Eleanor, Mrs. L. C. McIsaac, Fairview, Lucy, Mrs. Howard Smith, Rocky Point; Mary, Mrs. Harold MacDonald, Charlottetown; Everett, Hampshire; William, Hunter River; Louis, Kingston; Sterling, Meadow Bank; Earl, Oyster Bed Bridge; John, New Haven. Three children predeceased her in infancy and Eugene, as a young man of 21, was killed in World War Two, causing his parents and brothers and sisters much sorrow and grief.
