Red Cross Plays Stellar Part In Winnipeg Disaster

Another type of flood flows steadily into Red Cross Headquarters in the embattled city of Winnipeg—a flood of inquiries from all parts of the country as anxious citizens seek news of their relatives and friends. More than ten thousand such calls have been handled up to May 15th, by Red Cross volunteers working with a battery of more than fifty extra telephones set up for this purpose. Four thousand Red Cross workers in the city help distribute the food, clothing and equipment pouring in from coast to coast. They help provide food, shelter, clothing and other assistance for the fifty thousand dike workers, distraught to learn the thousands of casualties from it.

They staff the canteens and row out food and hot drinks to the workers on the dikes. In the Red Cross giant Relief headquarters established in the Civic Auditorium they register the evacuees,—the weary mothers and children, the homeless, the sick and those too old to work on the dikes. They find a bed on the crowded floors for them, cook hot meals, comfort the lost and bewildered, and distribute clothing. Red Cross also directs the evacuation of patients from hospitals, of the sick and injured from private homes, and it arranges for their transportation for those unable to pay for their own to selected areas outside the flood.

The car loads of hip waders, work gloves, heavy socks and other clothing and equipment that stream into the city from every direction as Red Cross branches across the country respond to the appeal melt like snow in the sun as they are dispatched to the front line battle of the dikes. Red Cross officials not only from Manitoba but from other Provinces form an integral part of the committees directing the disaster work. Dr. W. S. Stanbury, National Commissioner of the Canadian Red Cross Society and Mr. Colin Herrie, American Red Cross Disaster expert flew into Winnipeg in the early days of the flood to assist in the direction of Red Cross Disaster Aid.

All of this is costing the Canadian Red Cross thousands of dollars each day from an emergency fund always kept on hand in case of disasters. However, it can easily be seen that this fund will soon need replenishing and this is why the Canadian Red Cross Society has announced that its books are now open to receive contributions towards the Disaster Fund. Contributions from donors in this Province should be sent to Provincial Red Cross Headquarters, Charlottetown, or to Mrs. F. W. Strong, Treasurer, Summerside Red Cross Branch, 91 Central St., Summerside, and marked "Disaster Fund."

All veterans within Charlottetown and vicinity have been contacted by letter, urging that they attend, and the meeting will also be thrown open to the general public.

The kit which will be used for demonstration purposes, consists of a model home, trees, shrubs, hedges, etc., and by different arrangements shows quite clearly the advantages and disadvantages of layouts as they will be discussed by the two guest speakers.

Record Breaking Potato Shipments

Rail shipments of Prince Edward Island potatoes continue to break all previous records with a total of 11,151 carloads of last year's crop having left the province up until late today.

Rail shipments to date total 2,835 cars with the equivalent of 2,835 having been shipped by boat. Previous high for shipments was recorded in 1947 when 9,091 cars left the province.

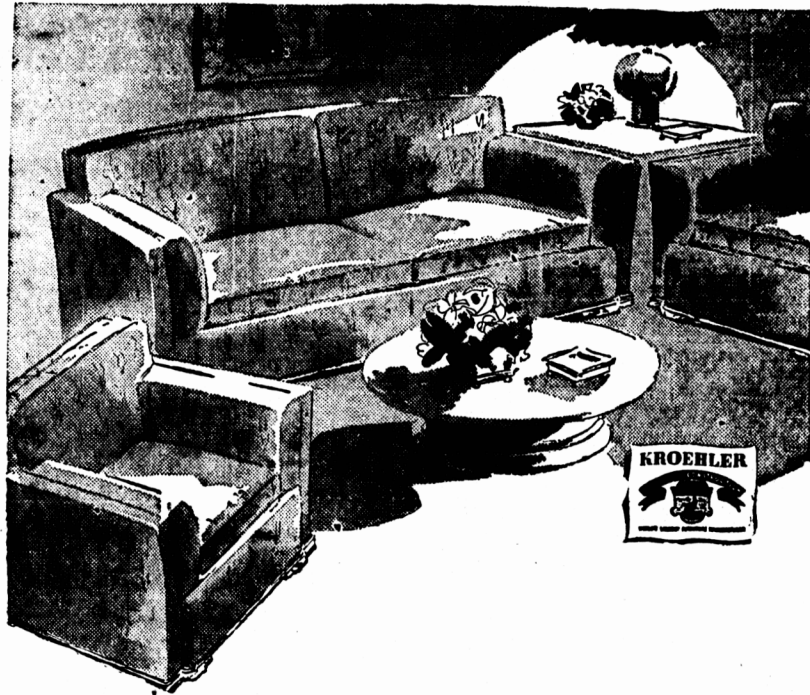
Most of the Island potatoes are going to Eastern United States and Canadian markets. One shipment went as far as North Dakota. Seed potatoes from this province went to buyers in 28 states in the United States this year.

Movement of the Island tubers continues to be heavy until the exportable surplus is used up. A supply of refrigerator cars is being maintained by the Canadian National Railways to protect the shipments from heat damage.

Shipments to date in May total 1102 cars—the highest ever recorded to this date.

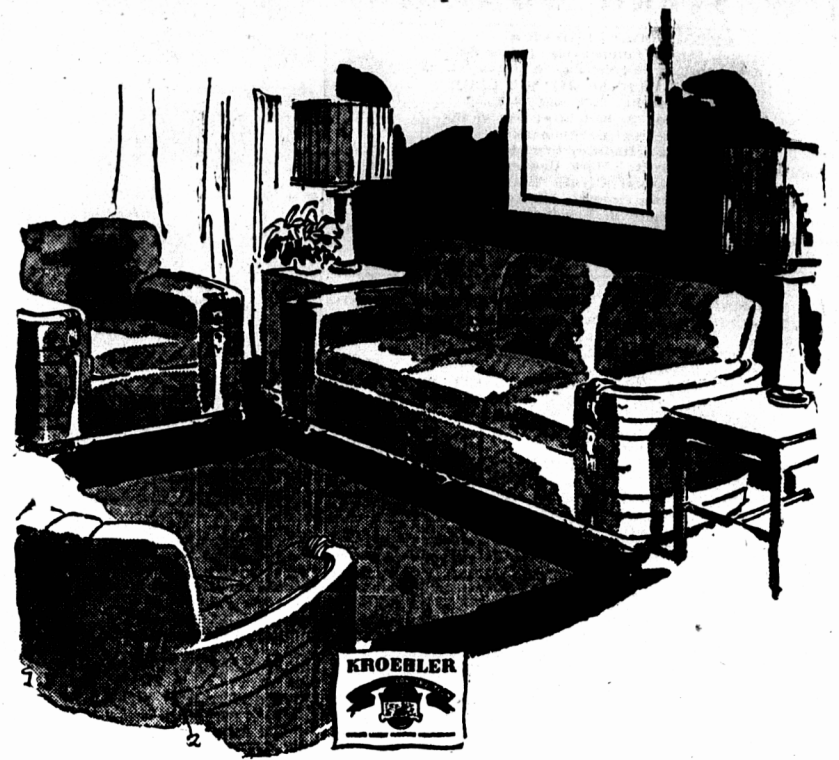

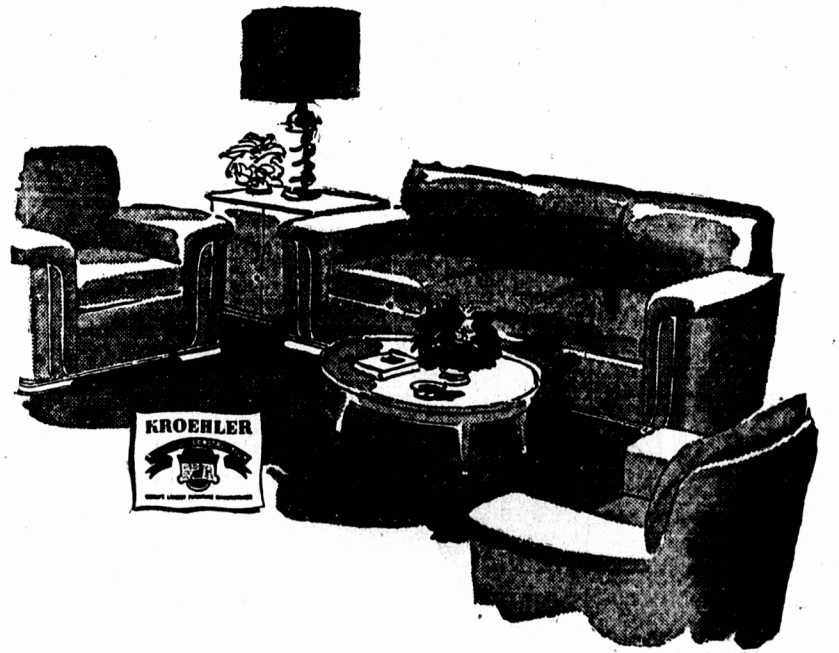

To Decide On La Motta Status

WASHINGTON, May 23 —(AP)—The National Boxing Association's national committee will vote on whether Jake LaMotta should continue as middleweight champion of the world.

In announcing this, President Fred J. Saddy of the N. B. A. said two questions will be asked: 1. Should recognition of LaMotta be withdrawn, with the winner of the fight between Ray Robinson and Robert Villmain declared the new champ?

They fight in Philadelphia June 5 and the Pennsylvania Athletic Commission already has announced it will recognize the winner as the middleweight king.

2. Should LaMotta be allowed to continue as champ, provided he wins his bout with Rocky Graziano in New York?

If the answer to the second question is yes, the N. B. A. said LaMotta would have to fight the Robinson-Villmain winner within 90 days.

"The N. B. A. does not wish to defend dilatory tactics by titleholders," Saddy said. "But, on the other hand, it wishes to avoid the establishment of dual championships."

The N. B. A. has been slow to lift a champion's title in the past. The last time this happened was in 1940. Then it discontinued the recognition of Lew Ambers as lightweight champion for failure to defend his title.

Doby Takes Over American League Batting Lead

CHICAGO, May 22 —(AP)—Larry Doby of Cleveland has taken over top spot in American League hitting.

His .415 average through games of Sunday was four points better than Philadelphia's Paul Lehner's .411. Doby, who was not among the leaders last week, replaced Walt Dropo of Boston at the top. Dropo dived to ninth place with his .346.

Others in the top 10: Sam Mele, Washington, .389, third; Phil Rizzuto, New York, .368, fourth; Tommy Henrich, New York, .364, fifth; John Pesky, Boston, .359, sixth; Bill Johnson, New York, .357, seventh; George Tebbetts, Boston,

.349, eighth; and Ed Stewart, Washington, .342, 10th.

Dom DiMaggio of Boston scored the most runs, 31, and his teammate Ted Williams batted the most in 36. Vern Stephens of Boston had the most hits, 41. Vic Wertz of Detroit and Rizzuto tied for the most doubles, 10, while Henrich had most triples, five. Williams hit the most homers, 11, and Bob Dillinger of Philadelphia stole the most bases, four.

Allie Reynolds of New York was leading pitcher with four victories and one defeat, and rang up the most strikeouts, 36.
