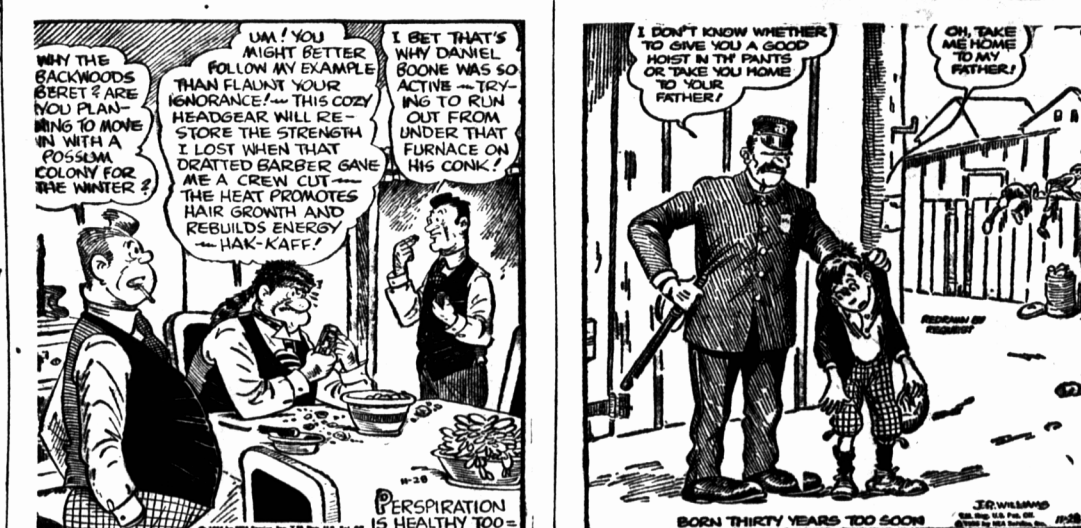

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ J 5
♥ 8 7 5 4 3
♦ K 6 4
♣ Q 6 3

WEST
♠ 10 9 8 4 2
♥ A 9 3
♦ 9 3

EAST
♠ A 7 6
♥ 6

SOUTH
♠ K Q 3

The bidding:
South West North East
1 ♣ Pass 2 ♣ Pass

Opening lead—ten of spades.

that South is in an apparently hopeless position. He must lose a spade, a heart and two clubs. But he didn't.

The ten of spades was covered with the jack, East winning the ace and returning a spade. South cashed the king and queen of spades, discarding a diamond from dummy.

The king of hearts was led and West won with the ace. Afraid to lead from his king of clubs, and having observed the diamond discard from dummy on the queen of spades, West returned the king of diamonds, declarer's apparent weakness.

The rest was easy. Dummy's king of diamonds won, trumps were drawn, and South ran his diamond suit, discarding two clubs from dummy. Result: four hearts bid and made, declarer losing a spade, a heart and a club.

West was at fault, of course, but this does not diminish the brilliance of South's strategy. He sold West a bill of goods and West bought it. He gave West the chance to make a mistake and West fell right into the trap.

Not that we think West should have led a club. That was dangerous. West's error came earlier—when he took the lead. He should have waited for the next trump lead so that he could get a signal from East.

This would have nipped the attempted swindle in the bud. A juicy club signal from East would have demolished declarer's scheme.

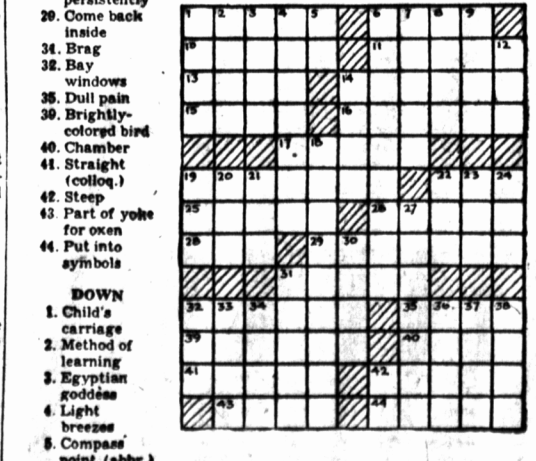

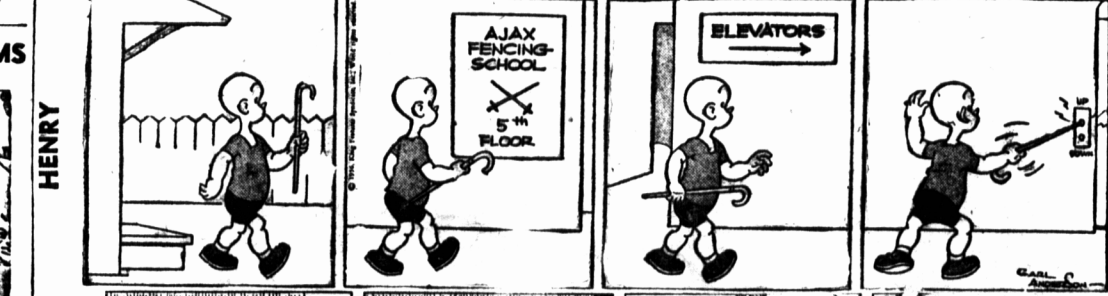
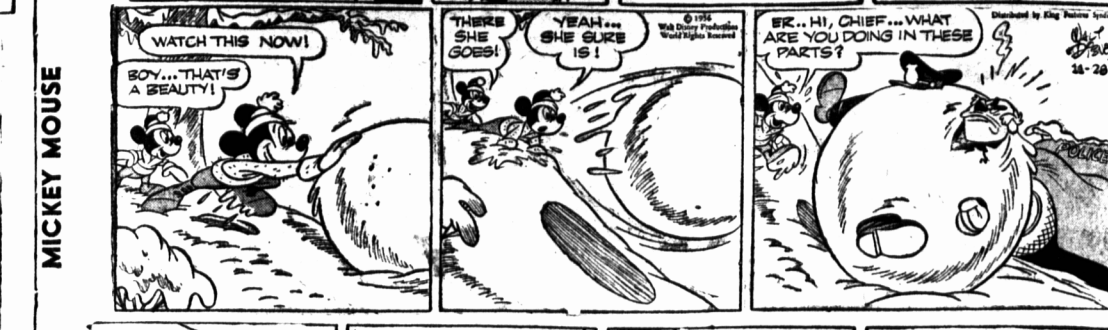
DAILY CRYPTOQUOTE — Here's how to work 'em
