HALIFAX (CP) - The weather office says snow was falling in New Brunswick and the western half of Nova Scotia late Wednesday evening.

A storm, south of James Bay, was moving east, and should be centred over Eastern Quebec this afternoon. The snow will change to rain in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island in New Brunswick. It should become mixed with rain in the southern regions in the morning, but in the north it will be entirely snow.

From four to six inches of snow are predicted in New Brunswick, and lesser amounts in the other two provinces before the changeover to rain. Clearing is forecast in the southwestern part of the district during the afternoon. Friday is expected to be sunny and colder in all parts of the Maritimes.

Regional forecasts: Northern Nova Scotia, Eastern Shore, Prince Edward Island: Overcast; snow changing in the afternoon to rain and in the evening to snowflurries; milder winds southeast 20 shifting this evening to west 20; low-high at New Glasgow and Goshen 23 and 36; Charlottetown 20 and 34; outlook for Friday, mostly sunny and colder.
