Island Designation 'Purely Speculative'

Statements by some Island members of Parliament that the province will become a designated area are "purely speculative", Premier Walter Shaw was advised from Ottawa yesterday.

The provincial government has been seeking to have federal authorities term the province a designated area so that tax incentives will be granted to new industries.

In light of statements made by Island members of Parliament in Ottawa, Premier Shaw telephoned the federal department of industry yesterday to see whether or not a decision has been made on whether or not Prince Edward Island will be made a designated area.

The premier was advised by the deputy minister of industry that suggestions that the whole province will be made "purely speculative and not out by people who have not received the correct information."

Wednesday, Solicitor General Watson MacNaught was quoted as saying he has "no doubt whatsoever" that the federal government's new program of

financial help for industries moving into designated areas will apply to the whole of Prince Edward Island.

Premier Shaw will take part in the first program and through the summer cabinet ministers and officials of government departments will be featured.

Funeral For Island Airman Set For Monday

Funeral services for Flt-Lt. John M. Craig, killed Thursday night in an aircraft crash, will be held Monday at 2:30 p.m. in Bedeque United Church, with interment in the church cemetery.

Flt-Lt. Craig, a veteran RCAF pilot, was returning from a routine training mission when his Sabre jet fighter crashed near Chatham, N.B.

A native of Middleton, he graduated from Prince of Wales College in 1948. He taught school on the island for one year before joining the RCAF. During his time in the air force, he did a tour of duty in France.

He is survived by his widow, the former Mary Morgan of Trenton, Ontario; two children, John Morgan, 11, and Mary Jane, 9. Also surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Craig of Middleton; one brother, Arthur, Central Bedeque; three sisters, Olive (Mrs. R. E. Wells, Vancouver, B. C.); Louise, Mrs. G. A. Gorbet, Halifax, N. S.; Catherine, Mrs. Dr. John Bonnell of P. E. I.
