Pledges "Positive" Action Against Terrorist Society At U. S. Airport

CHANUTE AIR BASE, Ill. (AP) The commandant of Chanute air force base has pledged "positive proceedings" against young airmen who have banded together in a secret terrorist society.

The group, indulging in rites including blood pledges of obedience and secrecy, is known as "Pachuco." Its operations resembled hoodlums carried on by bands of young toughs in New York, Los Angeles and other large cities.

Maj.-Gen. B. E. Gates, commandant of the base, promised "positive proceedings" and "continuous action" as his assurance that the air force will not tolerate "a few bad apples" contaminating a fine group of young men.

The crackdown came suddenly Sunday when the air force announced 30 young airmen had been seized as suspected members of the society.

They were questioned about "acts of violence and lawlessness ranging from AWL offences and marijuana addiction to knife assaults," Gen. Gates said.

Gen. Gates said officials learned a young airman had been taken out into the country, beaten and his chest carved with a razor blade to make it bleed profusely.

The youth said his attackers accused him of "ratting" on them. He said he could not identify the toughs.

Saturday morning parts of the base's 15,000 airmen were called out and ordered to strip to the waist. One hundred and seventy-five members had "unexplained marks or tattoos." Many carried switch blade knives.

Of these thirty were kept under detention. The general said they were "sully, arrogant and living

Five Categories Of Charges For McCarthy Probe

WASHINGTON, (AP)—A special Senate committee has announced five categories of charges on which it will start public hearings next Tuesday on the question of whether the Senate should censure Senator Joseph McCarthy Rep.-Wis.

Senator Arthur Watkins (R-Utah), chairman of the bipartisan six member committee, said the charges seemed to be "the most important" of 46 filed by three senators who have urged that McCarthy's conduct be officially condemned.

The five categories include:
1. "Incident of contempt of the Senate by McCarthy, centering largely around his failure to testify before a Senate elections sub-committee investigating his finances in 1950."
2. "Incidents of encouragement of United States employees to violate the law" in McCarthy's appeal to federal employees to give him classified information about alleged Communists or subversives.
3. "Incidents involving receipt or use of confidential or classified documents or other confidential information, from executive files," in connection with his receipt of a purported summary of an FBI espionage report in the McCarthy-Younger hearings.
4. Incidents involving alleged

Reds Protest U. S. Actions Over Spy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Soviet Russia has protested United States activities in the defection of Yuri A. Rastvorov, Soviet spy now in American hands, U. S. state department officials said Tuesday.

The protest was contained in a note denouncing American intelligence agencies for committing violence against Rastvorov, a top Far Eastern espionage agent for the Russians.

Rastvorov was disclosed to be in American hands some two weeks ago. At a press conference, he announced he had deserted the Soviets because "I wanted to live like a decent human being."

Report New Cement Plant For B. C.

VICTORIA (CP) — A cement manufacturing plant costing about \$5,000,000, is to be built in the Fraser valley about 15 miles east of Chilliwack, it was reported here Tuesday.

Trade Minister Ralph Chetwynd said Texas interests are involved in the new project which will employ between 60 and 100 men. Raw materials will come from B. C. limestone deposits.
