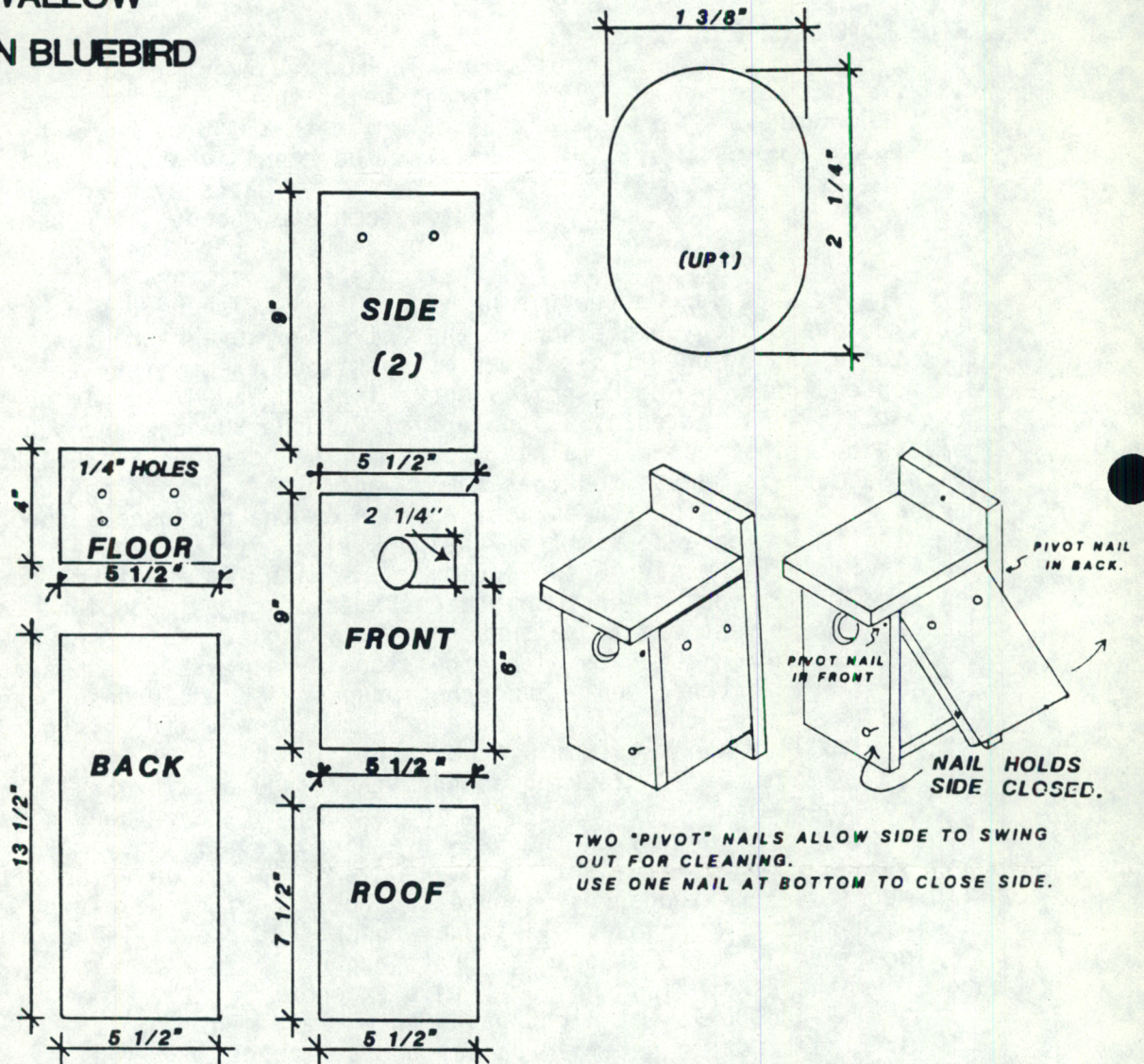


THE WILDLIFE CORNER
