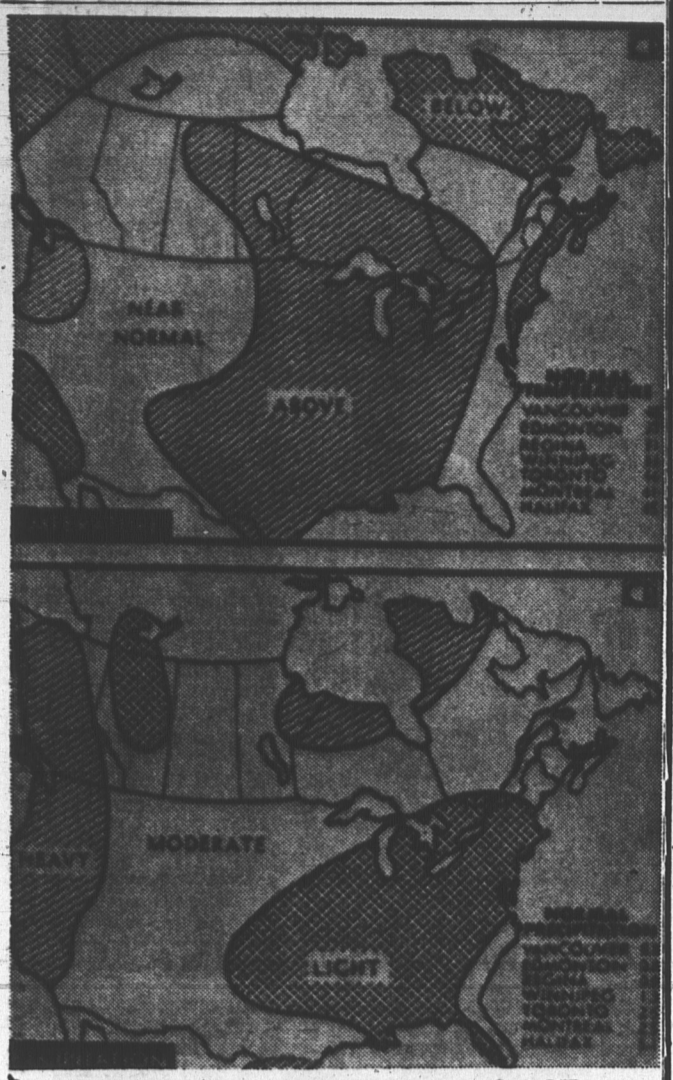

### MARTIN KEPT BUSY WELCOMING VISITORS

OTTAWA (CP) — Even for gregarious Paul Martin, minister of external affairs, this may be known as the year of the handshake.

Between Thursday and Tuesday, he is welcoming four more VIPs to Ottawa and holding meetings with them on international problems.

Thursday it was Foreign Minister Pierre Harmel of Belgium. Sunday it will be Foreign Minister George Brown of Britain. Monday is the turn of Louis Joxe, French minister of state. Tuesday Foreign Minister Frank Aiken of Ireland comes to town.

Subjects to be covered in these meetings will include NATO, Rhodesia, South West Africa, United Nations peacekeeping and, of course, Viet Nam.

Just so that he's not left at any loose ends, Mr. Martin will represent Prime Minister Pearson Friday at the opening of Montreal's subway.

**STARTED IN MAY**

Ever since May 16, when Arthur Goldberg, U.S. ambassador to the UN, came to Ottawa, there has been a constant stream of visitors.

UN Secretary-General U Thant visited Mr. Martin at the latter's home at Windsor, Ont., for two days in late May. That was just after Eirene White, British minister

of state, and Lord Caradon, British ambassador to the UN, were in Ottawa.

A June visitor was Deputy Premier Dmitri Polyansky of Russia. In that month, Mr. Martin attended the NATO ministerial meeting in Brussels.

July's visitors included Prime Minister Wilson of Britain and Commonwealth Caribbean leaders.

August brought Defence Minister Kai-Uwe von Hassel of West Germany.

September's crop included four French-speaking VIPs: Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville, Education Minister Christian Fouchet and UN ambassador Roger Seydoux of France and President Leopold Senghor of Senegal. Secretary-General Jose A. Mora of the Organization of American States also was here last month.

**FACE CONTINUES**

So far this month, visitors have included Foreign Minister Elisabeth Shima of Japan, Foreign Minister Pre Haekkerup of Denmark and Development Minister Pote Sarasin of Thailand.

Mr. Martin doesn't wait for people to come to him.

So far at this session of the General Assembly, he has conferred with at least 20 other foreign ministers in New York.

And he leaves Nov. 4 for a 12-day trip to Warsaw, Moscow and Rome.

### Home Of Founding Father Was Torn Down By Accident

OTTAWA (CP)—The story of how the federal government accidentally demolished the home of a Father of Confederation was told in the Commons by Northern Affairs Minister Laing.

It came after Maurice Allard (Ind - PC - Sherbrooke) asked why the home of Sir Alexander Galt in his Eastern Townships riding was left in ruins this summer.

"Why did the minister order the demolition of Galt House?" asked Mr. Allard, speaking for what he described as an angry English-speaking minority in Quebec.

Mr. Laing, who also has received a number of complaints, said he regretted having to say that "we have apparently de-

stroyed the home of a Father of Confederation."

In 1962, the federal government received a private request to restore Galt House in Sherbrooke, he said. A year later, the government agreed to look at it.

In 1965, the Dominican Sisters, a Roman Catholic religious order that owned the land, telephoned Ottawa to tell the government to move the house or it would be demolished. The order needed the land for expansion.

In a flurry of letters, the Eastern Townships Historical Society got the Quebec government to agree to pay half the cost of moving the house. Ottawa, however, said the City of Sherbrooke also would have to do its share. Sherbrooke agreed.

In late July, the Dominican Sisters told the government to move the house by Aug. 8 or it would be torn down.

Mr. Laing said a hurried effort to move the old brick home was made with the result that the house fell down.

"We didn't get it far. If we learned anything, it is that it is probably impossible to move a brick house of that age from a bedrock foundation."

An announcement by Mr. Laing's department last week said the Quebec government had withdrawn its undertaking to contribute to the cost of restoring the house.

### Britain Cuts Trade Deficit

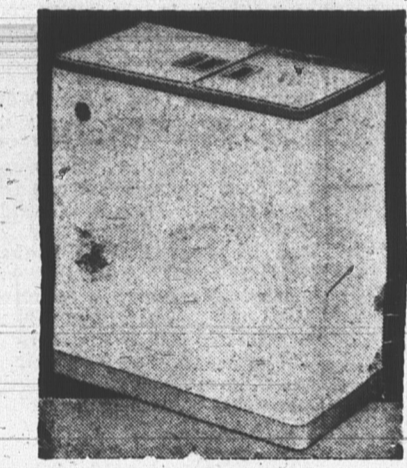
LONDON (Reuters) — Government measures to ease Britain's balance-of-payments problem won their first tangible reward with the announcement that last month's overseas trade deficit was the lowest this year.

A drop of £31,000,000 (\$93,000,000) in the imports coupled with a drop in export sales of £11,000,000 (\$33,000,000) produced a direct trading loss on the month of £49,000,000 compared with £69,000,000 in August.

Britain's valuable invisible exports — such as income from shipping and overseas insurance — boosted overseas income and resulted in an actual monthly loss of only £2,000,000 (\$6,000,000) against £17,000,000 (\$51,000,000) the previous month.

Trade Minister Douglas Jay said the figures appeared to show that the government's economic measures were having their intended effect.

Since January, the monthly trade deficit has varied between £6,000,000 and £54,000,000.
