Report India Will Shun Jap Peace Conference

Immigration Increase Seen As 80,000 Arrive This Year; 114 To P.E.I.

OTTAWA, Aug. 14 (CP) - Canada welcomed nearly 80,000 newcomers to her shores in the first six months of this year in a sudden rise in the tide of immigration.

The Citizenship Department reported today that the number up to June 30 was 79,785, more than double the total of 37,286 immigrants in the corresponding period of last year and nearly 6,000 more than the 73,172 who came to this country in the whole of 1950.

The bulk went to Ontario, which absorbed 45,032. Quebec received 15,204, Alberta 6,430; British Columbia 5,649, Manitoba 3,700, Saskatchewan 1,953, Nova Scotia 891, New Brunswick 639, Prince Edward Island 114, Newfoundland 113 and Yukon and the Northwest Territories 10.

The number of persons who left Canada in the same period was not

LONDON, Aug. 14 (Reuters) - The Admiralty tonight announced the appointment of Admiral Sir George E. Creasy as commander-in-chief of the British Home Fleet. Sir George, who succeeds Admiral Sir Philip L. Vian, has been vice-chief of naval staff since November 1949.
