## BULLDOZER FIRST AT DRILL SITE

The first piece of equipment on the new drilling site near Port Hill Station is a bulldozer which is clearing a right of way into the new location. Operations have ceased at Imperial-Wellington No. 1 and "the rig" will be moved to the new site taking a week or ten days to complete the 13 mile haul. The new drilling site chosen by Imperial Oil Company is near the highway on the farm of Bayfield Ramsay, located about 1 1/2 miles from the Western Road and about one mile from the Port Hill railway station.

# Duplessis Says Actions Planned In Gas Charges

His words on the subject, at his weekly press conference, were: "There will be not only one inquiry but several inquiries before the courts, and we will take the steps necessary to bring truth to light and to obtain justice."

Mr. Duplessis made no direct reference to the demand by Liberal Leader Jean Lesage that a royal commission inquiry be announced by July 2 into the gas transaction.

Before the start of his press conference Mr. Duplessis ordered Le Devoir reporter Guy Lamarche from his office. The premier called his chauffeur, Lieut. Jean Charles Gosselin of the provincial police, to escort Mr. Lamarche outside when the reporter sought to protest.

In a series of articles started June 13 the Montreal daily has said that a \$20,000,000 stock market coup marked the sale of the Montreal district household gas distribution system of Quebec Hydro, a government enterprise, to the privately-owned Quebec Natural Gas Corporation.

The newspaper has named seven cabinet ministers, one former cabinet minister now lieutenant-governor of the province, five legislative councillors and Mr. Duplessis' private secretary as shareholders or former corporation shareholders.

"The one who is speaking to you and the government of the Province of Quebec have nothing to hide and will hide nothing," said Mr. Duplessis.

Le Devoir, he added, continued to "wallow ever deeper in the mud of a propaganda and publicity odiously unjust and false."

"Judicial procedures will be taken against this newspaper, procedures which will bring to light before the public all the facts pertinent to the courts and which concern the question raised."

"The great scandal in this affair—and it is an odious scandal—is the unjust and frequently infamous propaganda of the newspaper called Le Devoir."

At a press conference Wednesday Liberal Leader Lesage said if no announcement of a royal commission inquiry was forthcoming by July 2 the Liberals would take the steps necessary to protect the rights of the people. He did not elaborate.

Mr. Duplessis did refer to a demand by Mr. Lesage that all orders-in-council dealing with the gas transaction be made public. The premier said the orders-in-council are available to any member of the Legislative Assembly.

Mr. Lesage, former member of the House of Commons, has yet to be elected to the Legislative Assembly.
