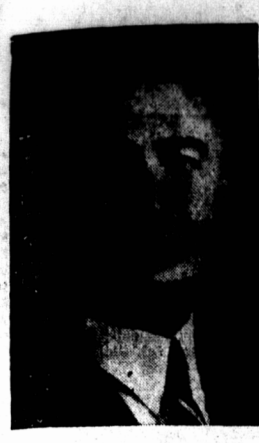
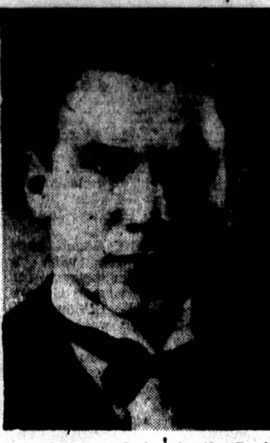


Will Launch Address



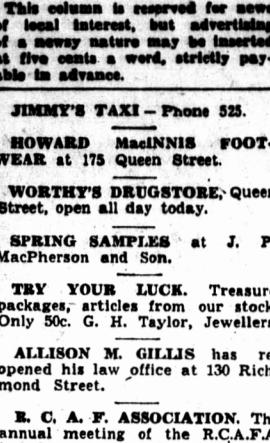

Farm Labour Situation



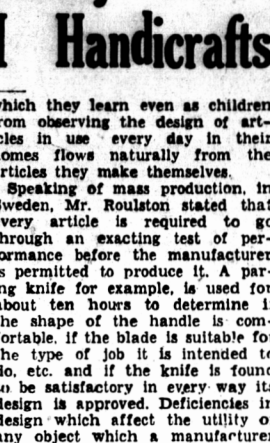
Just how much the farm labor situation in this Province will be affected this year by the expected labor migration to Labrador and other far northern Canadian points is one which may cause concern to employment officials.
