THE PUBLIC CREDIT—TREASURY WARRANTS.

The Islander of Friday pompously announces "that the Government have recently completed a negotiation with the Bank of Prince Edward Island, whereby they will very shortly be enabled to pay in cash every Warrant hereafter to be drawn upon the Treasury."

If, as the Islander states, the Bank will charge interest on all over-drawn monies—which we may be sure will amount to no insignificant sum—we are at a loss to know what saving there will be to the public revenue, as the rate of interest to be paid to the Bank will not be less than what is now paid to the holders of Warrants.

The leading article in the last Islander with respect to the leasehold tenure is the most equivocating we have ever read from the pen of the gentleman who, in endeavouring to serve his employers the proprietors, would fain make the tenantry believe that he is anxious for the advancement of their interests.
