

The New York Giants Facing Cleveland Browns Sunday

NEW YORK (AP)—New York Giants are getting ready to play Cleveland Browns instead of Paul Brown Sunday, and they are finding the switch calls for some changes in their own thinking.

Over the years, even when Cleveland was riding high and

New York not so high in the National Football League, the Giants have had unusual success against the Browns coached by Paul Brown. The teams have met 26 times since the Browns came into the NFL in 1950, and their series stands even—13-13-2. Only six games,

three won by each, have been decided by more than 10 points. Cleveland's biggest margin was 48 points in 1953. New York's biggest was 41 in 1959. And each of those years also produced a close score in the team's other meeting.

The Giants' veteran defence players say much of their success was due to the fact they could anticipate the plays Brown would call via his famed sideline quarter-shuttling players in and out with play calls on virtually every down. Years of experience and film study taught them to think the way Brown did.

Cardinals Are Talk Of League

NEW YORK (AP)—On the strength of three victories in four games and a highly impressive set of statistics, St. Louis Cardinals are becoming the talk of the National Football League.

Cleveland, however, is well down the defence list. The champion Green Bay Packers, who also run more than their pass, top the defence list, having yielded only 874 yards. But they're getting an argument from the Chicago Bears in the major defensive categories. The Bears, who have allowed 864 yards, have given up only 314 yards by rushing and four touchdowns. They have allowed their opponents the fewest points, 34, the fewest first downs, the fewest touchdowns and they have intercepted 11 passes.

But they haven't caught up with Cleveland Browns either in the standings or in offensive performances. NFL statistics released Wednesday show the Browns are No. 1 in five different offensive categories, including two of the most important — total yardage and points scores.

All this has happened since Coach Wally Lemm lost his top back, John Crow, before the season opened and full-back Prentice Gapp early in the opening game.

"Fortunately we have been able to fill the gaps. The rookies have been wonderful when called on," says Lemm conservatively.

The Browns, with power-running Jimmy Brown as their chief weapon, have run for 832 yards and passed for 802. They are one of two NFL teams to gain more on the ground than through the air, but they're tied with New York Giants for the most touchdown passes—nine.

Lawson claimed Pinson shoved him in an argument over a story written by Lawson in which the sports writer said Pinson's failure to hunt more often could cost him the National League batting championship. Pinson claimed he bunted when ordered to do so.
