## THE FIGHTING IN INDIA.

British Harrassed by Skirmishers.

Confidence of the Insurgents.

THEIR ABILITY AS GUERRILLAS.

Concentrating at Semphaga Pass.

SIMLA, Oct. 27.—Official advices received here from Kharappa announce that a large foraging party of British troops yesterday captured the village of Rimad-bang and recovered a quantity of supplies. On retiring, the troops were hotly followed by the enemy to within a mile of the British camp.

On the British side nine men, including Colonel Hadow, were wounded. The confidence of the insurgent tribesmen is increasing, and they are offering a determined front in all directions.

The British officers say that the tribesmen excel in guerilla warfare and are wonderful skirmishers.

The enemy is fully supplied with ammunition and large reinforcements are joining the insurgent camps.

The tribesmen have massed twenty thousand men at Semphaga Pass, where they are making rifle pits and strengthening their defences. Though hard fighting is possibly in store it is hoped that the pass will be carried without a great effort.

Meanwhile, 'tis bad news that the tribesmen have begun to operate on the British lines of communication. The fear is that, finding this the most successful means of delaying the British advance, they will detach still larger bodies to attack the British convoys and cut up the escorts.

Yesterday the tribesmen harassed the British camp at Klansabur by constant well directed fire. Nearly thirty non-commissioned officers and men were wounded.

## MAYORALTY ELECTION IN NEW YORK.

The Odds on Tammany.

BETTING MEN LOSING CONFIDENCE

NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—It is safe to say that the betting men regard Tammany's chances as the best in the New York election. But despite this feeling, the odds on Van Wyck against the field have been lowered, and five to four seems the best procurable.

**HEROIC GORDON HIGHLANDERS.**  
Deadly Line of Fire Held No Terrors for Them When Ordered to Charge.

SIMLA, Oct. 24.—Despatches from Kharappa say that it is impossible to praise too highly the conduct of the Gordon Highlanders at the storming of Dargalidge. When Brigadier General Kemper realized that the British gun fire, aided by the mountain battery from Fort Gulistan, could not dislodge the enemy and went forward in person to move the Gordon Highlanders and the Third Sikhs into the fighting line for a systematic assault, Col. Mathias, commander of the Gordon Highlanders, addressed his men in this stirring appeal: "Men of the Gordon Highlanders—our general says that position must be taken at all costs. The Gordon Highlanders will take it."

The men gave a rousing cheer and when the advance sounded they bounded after their leader, the officers at the head. When they came down the slope after the successful charge they were spontaneously cheered by all the other regiments. The Gourkas also behaved magnificently throughout the engagement. Captain Robinson of the Gourkhas, acted with the greatest gallantry. He led his men across the fire zone to cover. Finding the force there insufficient, he returned alone over the death trap. He was mortally wounded while leading the second rush to support the first contingent.

Many acts of heroism are recorded of the rank and file. The total casualties of the day were 134, and the Gordon Highlanders lost 39 in the rush through the line of fire.

General Westmacott's brigade is now encamped in the Khan-Ki valley. He has cleared the enemy from the heights commanding the valley and destroyed their towers.

HALIFAX, Oct. 24.—The Leinster regiment arrived from Bermuda yesterday to relieve the Royal Berks. They marched to the barracks without the usual courtesy of the regimental band from the parting regiment. The Berks were aboard the trooper today, and again there was no music, as the Berks' instruments were packed on board ship and the Leisters for some reason were not disposed to turn out. The explanation of this remarkable absence of complimentary bands to each other on such an occasion is said to be that the two regiments are not on good terms.
