**Moe Norman Captures CPGA Championship**

CALGARY (CP) — Colorful Moe Norman of Gifford, Ont., Saturday captured the Canadian Professional Golfers Association championship to continue a love affair with Calgary that he started in 1955.

Norman, who closed with a four-under-par 67 for a 54-hole total of 204, nine under par, defeated Frank Fowler of Calgary by three shots. Jack Bissegger of Bellefleur, Que., finished two shots further back in third place.

Other winners were: Texas Dean (2:17.25), Sugar Truck (2:13.45), Sammie Gibb (2:13.45), Biddy Scott (2:11.45), The Red

Fowler entered the final round with a one-stroke edge over Norman, who already had won the Alberta open and the Willow Park pro-amateur in Calgary this year.

Norman's infatuation with Calgary began in 1955 when he won the Canadian amateur championship.

He won \$2,000 and the Seagram Shield Saturday to boost his official earnings for 1966 to \$13,300.

**PRaises COURSE**  
Norman, always ready with a quip or a quote, had special praise for the cozy Willow Park layout, only 6,600 yards long.

"It's short enough that you don't have to concentrate on anything but mowing the ball," Norman said.

"I like the length," Fowler, a local favorite, had little to say after Norman stole the lead and went on to win. Behind Bissegger came Lyle Crawford of Vancouver with 210. Al Baiding and George Knudson of Toronto and Will Homenuik of Winnipeg, all familiar with the United States pro tour, tied for fifth at 211.

Homenuik won the championship last year.

Neil Green of Calgary followed at even-par 213 and Al Patterson of Winnipeg and Bill

Wright Jr. of Edmonton managed 214.

**WAS ACCURATE**  
Norman, second to Homenuik last year and third in 1960, displayed great accuracy Saturday as he cruised to a record CPGA total. The previous low of eight under par for three rounds was set by Baiding in Edmonton three years ago.

Norman, who moved ahead of Fowler for good on the eighth hole, had not won the CPGA previously. In his round Saturday, he played with Crawford, whom he defeated in 1955 to win the amateur.

"He taught me how to lose then and I haven't been able to shake the habit," Crawford said.

Fowler won \$1,500, Bissegger \$1,200 and Crawford \$1,000. Payoffs ranged down to \$102 for five players who finished at 220 to complete the top 30.

A major disappointment was the failure of Stan Leonard of Vancouver, eight-time CPGA winner, to get his game in gear.

**Americans Take Gordon Cup**

LAKE PLACID, N.Y. (AP) — The United States completed an 8-0 sweep over Canada in winning the Gordon Cup tennis trophy Saturday for the third consecutive year. The competition is between senior players chosen by the U.S. Lawn Tennis Association and the Canadian LTA.

The Americans had won three ship-builders, followed by British and West Germany. Japan led Friday in the opening of the two-day competition. They won three doubles and one singles Saturday.

R. Clifford Owen of Detroit, Pa. beat Jack Bonus of Montreal, 7-5, 6-3 in the singles match.

In the doubles, Col. Nicholas E. Powell of Washington, D.C. and Martin Galar of Cleveland beat Claude Fung of A-Ling of Montreal and F. Bernard of Toronto, 6-3, 6-1. Frank A. Thompson of St. Louis and Randolph Gregson of New Orleans defeated Leslie Stemeny of Montreal and Gordon Robertson of Niagara Falls, Ont., 6-0, 6-4, and Arthur R. Hills and Robert Mass, doubles of Montreal, defeated Ellis Tarsis and George Barta, 6-3, 6-1.
