

### Child Is Fatally Injured In Accident On Alexander Drive

Four-year-old John Lee Whitlock, son of Mr. and Mrs. John "Toxy" Whitlock, Alexander Drive, was fatally injured yesterday morning when struck by a payload carrier operating near his home on Alexander Drive.

Taken to the Prince Edward Island Hospital by N.D. MacLean's ambulance, the boy died shortly after his arrival.

Police report the machine was being operated by Wilfred McCuskey, an employee of the City of Charlottetown at the time of the accident.

An inquest was held yesterday by Coroner Dr. L.E. Prowse. In addition to his parents the

boy is survived by two sisters, Connie and Frances and one brother George. Another sister predeceased him a few years ago.

Members of the coroner's jury are Freeman Archer (foreman), Edward Brooks, John Arsenault, Vernon Currie, Wallace Coles, Maurice Murphy and Melvin White.

DYER BAY, Ont. (CP) — A highways department snowblower drilled through a six-mile, 15-foot drift late Monday, lifting the three-week winter siege of this Georgian Bay community and permitting the removal of a seriously ill heart case.

The highways department crew

aimed the snowblower into the blocked sidewalk off Highway 6 around 3:30 p.m. Monday. They rode into Dyer Bay at 6 p.m.
