A hasty visit to the Experimental Farm shows that the energetic Superintendent, J. A. Clark, has already effected a great transformation in the old homestead and grounds of Havenwood. The house has been thoroughly repaired, almost rebuilt, in fact, completely has it been modernised. A new roof has been put on, new windows throughout have been put in, the entire front modernised, a new kitchen and offices built, the internal arrangements quite transformed, a new heating system supplied, together with the city water, a sewerage connection, electric lighting and telephone connection. When the work now in progress is completed, which Messrs Lowe Brothers are contractors, the Superintendent's official residence will be admirably adapted for the purposes it is intended to serve and will present a handsome appearance. In the meantime very extensive changes have been made in the grounds. Old fences, edges and trees have been removed, one of the latter being of giant size, and the stumps torn up, groves have been thinned out and a general process of transformation and renovation has been put in progress. A beginning has been made in planting currant and other small fruits, flat lowering has been done and a plot prepared for strawberry culture. These are but hints of what has been put under way. But what has been done gives great promise that when the plans are fully developed and carried out, which will yet take much time and labor, the Experimental Farm will be something to be proud of. It has evidently been entrusted to competent hands.
