Contract Bridge

EXPERT DEFENSE NEEDED

It is fair to guess that the optimistic game contract in today's deal would be made against all defenders short of expert status, just as it was made against the actual East-West pair.

South dealer.
North-South vulnerable.

The bidding:
South West North East
1♣ 1♠ 5♠ 2♠

South might well have doubled two spades for a takeout, but, by the same token, North might also have been more conservative and not raised four clubs to five on his one possible trick. If South had really had 10 sure tricks in his own hand, he presumably would have started with a two-bid, or would have jumped all the way to five clubs. However, it is always a little embarrassing to criticize an action which leads to success!

West opened the lead of spades, and East played the king. This, however, did not discourage West or force him to change his plans! He continued with the spade king, knowing that South would probably ruff, but not caring. "Let South use up the trumps."

Declarer did ruff, of course, and he could not have liked his own prospects, but there was a chance—an exceedingly slim one!—and he went out for it. There was no sense in going to dummy and finessing on the trump queen—
even if that play succeeded, what would South do with his two losing diamonds? No, the "chance" previously mentioned depended on (aside from a lot of luck!) keeping the diamond ace entry in dummy, so South had to lay down the two top trumps. The queen fell, and after East's last trump was drawn, South had the second "break" of dropping the outstanding hearts in three leads! So dummy's fourth heart provided the fulfilling trick.

West's defense it must be admitted that dummy's heart suit did not look very menacing! However, there was danger in that direction, judging by the bidding; and since East had called for a shift by playing his lowest spade, West should have shifted to diamonds. South could not get a discard on dummy's diamond suit, but he might, conceivably, in hearts, so the thing to do was to take out that lone entry to dummy!

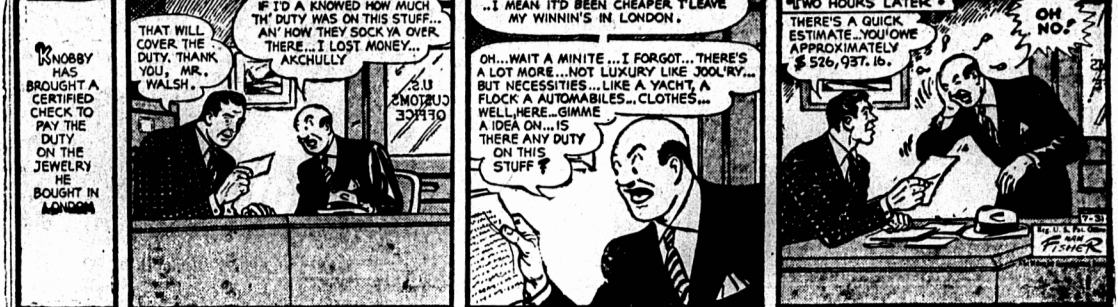

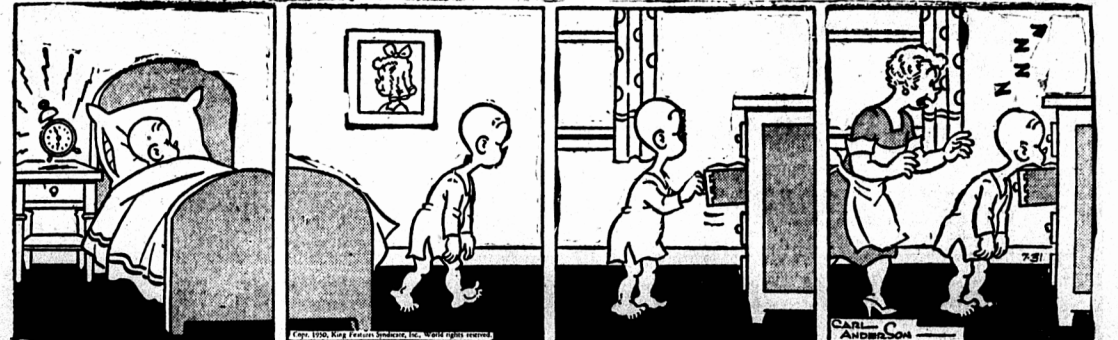
