

### Rochon Still in Running In Dixie Tourney

TAMPA, Fla., Jan. 3—(AP)—Favorites kept on advancing in the Dixie tennis tournament to-day, but Henri Rochon of Montreal and Tony Vincent of Miami had close calls.

Rochon, top-seeded among foreign entries, had the toughest time, having to come from behind against Leon Wilson of Jacksonville. The score was 4-6, 6-3, 6-3.

Vincent also took three sets to beat Jack Borling of Orlando, 6-2, 2-6, 6-0.

Defending champion Gardner Mulloy of Miami, seeded no. 1, had a still workout against hard-hitting Bob Light of Daytona Beach. Mulloy won 6-4, 6-1.

Second seeded Bryan (Betsy) Grant of Atlanta, Ga., romped over Jim Vulle of St. Petersburg, 6-1, 6-1.

### St. Mary's Blast Out 8-1 Victory Over Saint John

HALIFAX, Jan. 3—(CP)—Halifax St. Mary's, continuing their winning ways, blasted Saint John Beavers 8-1 here tonight before 4,400 Maritime Major Hockey League fans.

The Saints, sharpshooters all the way, banged in three goals in the first and third periods and squeezed in two in the second.

Beavers second string goalie, Gordon Mabee, did his best but he had little chance as the Saints fired rubber from all angles. Mabee stopped 29 of the 37 shots thrown at him while his opposite number, Don O'Hearn turned aside 27 of 28.

Despite the difference in shots, however, O'Hearn had the toughest time. Beavers, far from outplayed, gave him plenty of work

and several of their drives were definite goal material. Only O'Hearn made the game as lopsided as it was.

Johnny Morrow scored for Saints to open the game and Beavers tied it up when Johnny Ubricco cashed in. Before the first period had closed, however, Saints collected two more and from then on the league-leading visitors never came close.

Pete Leswick was once again a standout for the locals and Joe MacArthur was particularly effective in the closing period.

Johnny Morrow, late of Charlottetown Islanders, led the Saints with a pair of markers and an assist. Danny Nixon, Dewey Thompson, Frank Bergeron, Bill Ford, Leswick and MacArthur had the others.

Kenny MacKenzie of Halifax was injured in the second period but will make the road trip coming up although he may not be able to play for a few days.

Johnny Arundel, Carl Smelle and Mesich turned in top games for Beavers with Mesich in particular a power of strength on the defence.

The players involved are right winger Roger Bedard, defencemen Orvall Laval and Andy McCallum. Coach Lamoureux is definitely interested in Bedard and possibly one of the defencemen.

Bedard has been a standout in the American Hockey League for several seasons and has always ranked well up in the scoring races. A recent deal by which Providence secured four players has overstocked the Reds with right wingers.

Coach Lamoureux will be in contact with Reardon today by phone concerning the players. The outcome of the transaction may depend upon the selling price of the player or players.

Reardon inquired about the Providence players with the Islanders and stated that either he or Johnny Gagnon (the Black Cat of Chicoutimi) would be in Charlottetown shortly to see the athletes.

### Vejar-Bolanos Bout Tonight

NEW YORK, Jan. 3—(AP)—Chico Vejar, a young welter on the way up, meets Enrique Bolanos, Los Angeles veteran who fought for the lightweight title three times, in tomorrow night's 10-round feature at Madison Square Garden.

Vejar is a lopsided 14-5 favorite in the bout.

Although Vejar lost to Eddie Compo last September, the only defeat in his 37-bout career, this will be the big test for the 20-year-old from Stamford, Conn. Bolanos is the most important name he ever fought.

The ringside Bolanos, veteran of 83 fights, had a mediocre year in 1951, winning only three of nine starts. In his last start, Jan. 1, Bolanos fought a draw with Manny Madrid in Hollywood. His record is 66-14-3.

### Randy Turpin No. 1 Boxer

LONDON, Jan. 3—(AP)—Randy Turpin, logical contender for Sugar Ray Robinson's world middleweight title, has been selected as the No. 1 British boxer in 1951 by the British Boxing Writers' Club.

Of the 56 listed, 11 appeared on one or both of the recent world ranking lists issued by the National Boxing Association of the United States and Ring Magazine. These lists generally are accepted as official wherever professional boxing is staged.
