## Prime Minister Makes Brief Montague Visit

MONTAGUE — A quick trip to Montague, between major stops at Charlottetown and Summerside, rounded out Prime Minister John Diefenbaker's tour here today.

The Prime Minister alighted from his chartered aircraft about two o'clock at the city airport and was greeted by a host of well-wishers and party workers.

After a few minutes of hand-shaking and cheers, the Prime Minister was whisked away in a long motorcade of slogan-draped automobiles for a quick tour around Charlottetown.

Led by police motorcycles and a sound car playing marching music, the motorcade drew hundreds of afternoon shoppers from stores onto the sidewalks.

The motorcade headed out of the city on a planned non-stop run to Montague. A group of about 40 school children lined up along the road at the Southport intersection brought the motorcade to a stop, however, and the Prime Minister chatted briefly with the children.

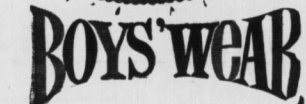

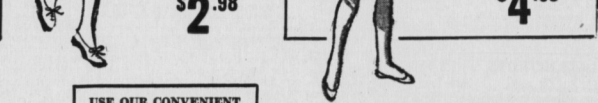

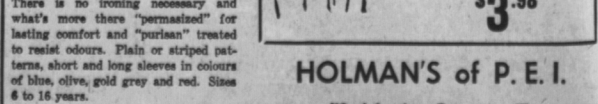

## N. S. Light, Power Reports Top Year

HALIFAX (CP) — The Nova Scotia Light and Power Company Ltd. says in its annual report that 1961 was one of the most successful in its history, with net income showing an increase of 14 per cent.

The report placed net income from operations at \$5,019,079, compared to \$4,600,000 the previous year.

Revenue of \$19,458,152 represented an increase of 8.6 per cent.

Net earnings on 1,018,304 shares amount to \$1.27 a share compared to \$1.11 a share the previous year.

The company, which also operates the Halifax trolley service, noted in the report that revenues from the transit system continued to decline. The loss on the system totalled \$32,000.

Total sales of electricity amount to 795,307,676 kilowatt-hours, an increase of 15 per cent.
